It was a busy week for the Glencoe-Silver Lake/Lester Prairie wrestling team as the Panthers hosted a triangular meet on Thursday, Jan. 4, before trekking north to Ogilvie for an invitational tournament two days later.

GSL/LP finished fourth at the Ogilvie Invitational with 134 points in the nine-team event. St. Croix Falls took first with 232 points.

Cody Rae had a big day in the

central Minnesota town, claiming a tournament-high three wins by fall at 170 pounds and also claiming the fastest fall of the invite with a 12-second victory. He finished third at 170 with a one-minute fall.

The Panthers earned two individual runner-up finishes at the meet. Carter Ruschmeier placed second at 106, as did Sawyer Varpness at 113.

Zachary Voelz placed third at 126, as did Theo Luciano at 160 and Aaron Castillo at 195. Luciano and Castillo won their final placements

by fall.

Brent Lipke was fourth at 138, with Aaron Higgins and Keegan Lemke taking fifth at 120 and 145, respectively. Zach Wanous was sixth at 220.

Two nights earlier, GSL/LP hosted WEM-JWP and Mankato East in the Black Gym at GSL.

The Panthers went 0-2 on the night, including a tough loss to the

Boys' cagers defeat Saints

The Glencoe-Silver Lake boys' basketball team got back in action to open the new year by going 1-1 in its first two games of 2018.

Tipping off January, the Panthers headed to Jordan for a sectional matchup against the Hubmen. It was the first of seven January road games for GSL, with the team playing in Glencoe just twice this month.

The extended away test did not

start out well, with the Panthers falling behind by double digits in the first half at Jordan en route to a 60-41 loss that dropped GSL below .500 for the first time this season.

Forward Connor Kantack's 11 points paced the visitors, with front-court mates Gabe Roepke and Austin Barrett logging nine and eight points, respectively.

The Panthers got back to the break-even point at 5-5 two nights later with a 50-32 win in another

sectional tilt at LeSueur-Henderson.

Led by a game-high 19 points by forward Kyle Christensen and 14 points from guard Dane Schwartz, GSL handled the Saints from start to near finish.

The Panthers seized the lead early and held on until the end of the contest – which was called in favor of the visitors with 8.8 seconds remain-

Girls' hoops snap long losing streak vs. NL-S

With leading scorer McKenna Monahan back in the fold, it was all systems go for the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' basketball team. The Panthers rolled to two wins, including a narrow victory at New London-Spicer in the Wright County Conference West opener, squelching a three-game losing streak that bookended New Year's Day.

GSL opened 2018 the same way it closed out 2017 – with a sizable loss. Following up on a 70-55 loss to BOLD in the third-place game

of the GSL Holiday Tournament four days earlier, the Panthers fell 62-44 at sectional opponent Jordan on Tuesday, Jan. 2.

The hosts cruised to a 37-12 halftime lead against GSL before the visitors put up a 32-point second half to keep the final deficit under two handfuls. Guards Miah Monahan and Olivia Lemke recorded 19 and 15 points, respectively, to lead the Panthers.

McKenna Monahan was back in the lineup two nights later as GSL traveled to take on perennial WCC

After a GSL/LP forfeit at 182, a double forfeit at 195

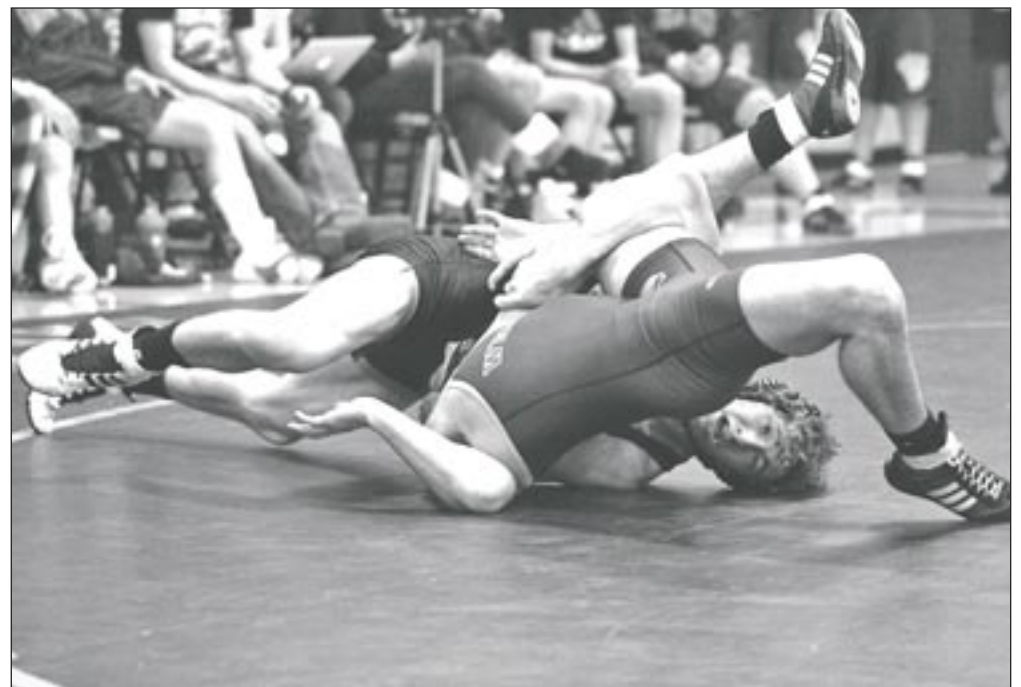

The co-captain did not disappoint in her return to the team following an ankle injury suffered in the opening game of the holiday tournament, as she blistered the Wildcats with a game-high 27 points to lead the Panthers to a 47-45 victory.

Lemke scored nine points, with guards Miah Monahan and Alison Kettner both chipping in four points and forward Kaitlyn Uecker logging three points to account for the entirety of GSL scoring in the tightly-contested matchup.

The victory snapped the Panthers' eight-game losing streak to the Wildcats.

GSL's last win versus NL-S came in a 46-45 home victory on Feb. 12, 2013. In that game, Clarissa Ober led all scorers with 23 points, while Maddie Monahan recorded 15 points.

Ober now plays for the

Chemnitz ChemCats in Germany, while Monahan is in her freshman year playing for the Bulldogs at Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa.

Following up its triumphant feast at NL-S, the Panthers put a cherry on top of their victory sundae with a 47-25 thumping of host Delano on Saturday, Jan. 6. Individual stats were not available.

GSL remained on the road for a WCC West contest at Dassel-Cokato on Tuesday, Jan. 9, after the Chronicle went to press. The Chargers entered that game with a 3-7 overall record.

The Panthers return home for the first time in 2018 by hosting another conference opponent in Litchfield on Friday night. The Dragons entered this week with a 9-3 record, but lost 63-30 to Hutchinson, a team that GSL defeated 79-72 on Dec. 8.

Junior high teams excel at super-region

Back in December, Glencoe-Silver Lake (GSL) had qualified four Knowledge Bowl teams to advance to the Southwest Minnesota Region 6 and 8 "Super-regional" junior high meet. Thursday, Jan. 4, was the day for 51 teams from 29 schools to meet at Southwest Minnesota State University (SMSU) in Marshall and find out who had the best team of seventh- to ninth-grade Knowledge Bowlers.

Team members earned the first-place gold medals with a total score of 127.5, 21.5 points ahead of Minnesota, which earned second. Marshall County Central (MCC) placed third with 101.5. The team members with this spectacular performance were Allie Gronlund, Kendra Klobe, Vera Kornilova, Eli Kuehn, Paul Sievert and Nathan Warner.

As mentioned above, GSL White competed in Room One for one round, but also competed in Rooms Two and Three. It finished in a tie for sixth place, with a score of 100.0. (Seven teams were grouped in a cluster with a spread of just two points.) This team included Kobe Boozikee, Lilly Ehrke, Devin Forcier, Rachel Trebesch and Kayla Reichow.

GSL Grey finished 22nd with a score of 84.0, and

jumped from Room 13 for the first round to Room Five at the end, a very notable move. The team members were Austin Brewton, Summer Hayes, Cade Herrmann, Lydia Rakow and Jon Ramige.

GSL Purple was very close behind, finishing in 24th with a score of 83.0. It competed for one round in Room Eight and three rounds in Room 11. This team had Sara Cross, Jenna Neyers, Calista Pedraza, Zach Reichow, Zoe Ruschmeier and Aaron Ward.

Junior high coach Eric Anderson was very pleased, and said that the teams had a solid effort overall. To have four teams in the top 24 at a meet of this size is outstanding.

At this point in GSL's junior high season, now that they are done with the big junior high meet, the many ninth graders will begin to compete with the older high schoolers at the junior varsity level.

It's another good news, bad news type of week.

The good news, unfortunately, is behind us as temperatures warmed to near 40 degrees early in the week and, even though it only lasted a few days, it certainly was nice. Everything will change midweek on the heels of a large storm system forecast to impact the upper Midwest. Wednesday will start out warm and that will play into some of the forecast issues with the storm itself. Most models have it starting out as a bit of a rain/snow mix before changing to all snow late Wednesday. The other problem is figuring out where it will go which, as I write this, is still a big question mark. On Sunday, it looked like it would head more toward St. Cloud and Brainerd, and Monday had it more towards Mankato. In short, we should receive some snow and if I were a betting man, odds are good we'll see at least a couple inches as the band could be wide, but the heavy snow band could be quite narrow. Both previous storms this year have fizzled once they got here, so I'll say a dusting to 2 inches on the low end and most likely 3- to 6 inches (isolated areas of 6+). The wind will really get going behind the storm, so travel may be a bit tricky into Friday.

High temperatures will have a tough time getting to 0 Saturday and Sunday, so back into the freezer we go. The extended shows another batch of cold air brewing in northern Canada, so we may warm early next week followed again by a cold snap. Welcome back to winter!

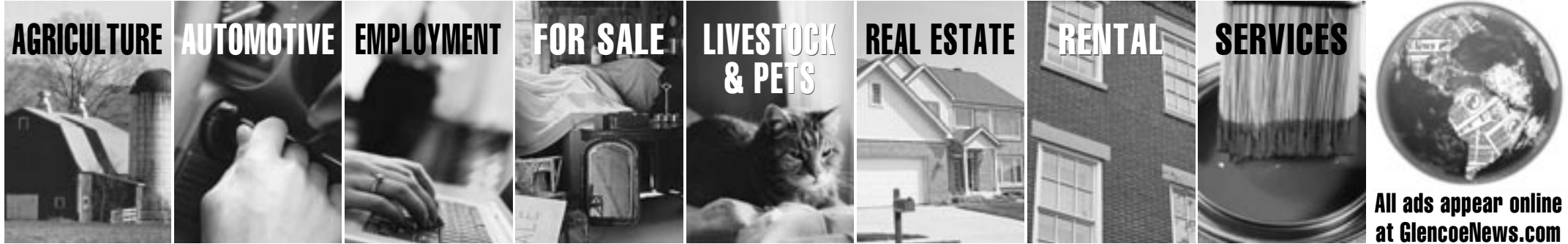
