

# Grapplers take fourth at Ogilvie

# oys' cagers defeat Saints

The Glencoe-Silver Lake boys' basketball team got back in action to open the new year by going 1-1 in its first two games of 2018.

Tipping off January, the Panthers headed to Jordan for a sectional matchup against the Hubmen. It was the first of seven January road games for GSL, with the team playing in Glencoe just twice this month.

The extended away test did not

start out well, with the Panthers falling behind by double digits in the first half at Jordan en route to a 60-41 loss that dropped GSL below .500 for the first time this season.

Forward Connor Kantack's 11 points paced the visitors, with frontcourt mates Gabe Roepke and Austin Barrett logging nine and eight points, respectively.

The Panthers got back to the break-even point at 5-5 two nights later with a 50-32 win in another

# Girls' hoops snap long losing streak vs. NL-S

With leading scorer McKenna Monahan back in the fold, it was all systems go for the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' basketball team. The Panthers rolled to two wins, including a narrow victory at New London-Spicer in the Wright County Conference West opener, squelching a three-game losing streak that bookended New Year's

GSL opened 2018 the same way it closed out 2017 - with a sizable loss. Following up on a 70-55 loss to BOLD in the third-place game

of the GSL Holiday Tournament four days earlier, the Panthers fell 62-44 at sectional opponent Jordan on Tuesday, Jan. 2.

The hosts cruised to a 37-12 halftime lead against GSL before the visitors put up a 32-point second half to keep the final deficit under two handfuls. Guards Miah Monahan and Olivia Lemke recorded 19 and 15 points, respectively, to lead the Panthers.

After a GSL/LP forfeit at 182, a double forfeit at 195


