Cagers remain on a roll

After a pulse-pounding pair of contests, the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' basketball team deserves a week off. However, after claiming second-half rallies to win both games last week – including a double-overtime victory in south Minneapolis - the Panthers might not want to cool their heels.

GSL claimed a thrilling 57-55 win at Minnehaha Academy on Tuesday, Jan. 13. The winning streak then hit five games with a 55-46 home triumph over Wright County Conference western division rival Annandale in the opening game of circuit play three nights later.

Friday's win over the Cardinals gave the Panthers a onethird share of the early lead in the WCC West and an 11-4 overall record - best in the division - entering the week.

It didn't look at first like

GSL would open last week on big," Otto-Fisher said. "Such a happy note. With just two minutes to play, they trailed Minnehaha - a 2014 state tournament team that was riding a four-game winning streak – by a score of 49-41.

However, the Panthers stormed back and forced overtime by recording four points in the closing moments of regulation to send the game into the extra session.

"It was impressive how the girls fought back after being down by 11 points and then by four points with 14 seconds to go," Otto-Fisher said.

Neither GSL nor Minnehaha managed to record a single point in the first added frame. It wasn't until guard Maddie Monahan sank a pair of free throws with 33 seconds left in the second overtime that the game was settled with the Panthers earning a gritty twopoint win over their stunned hosts.

"Our defense stepped up

a fun game to watch. The girls did what our theme is this year, 'Never give up.' They played until the final buzzer. It was a huge win for them."

Guard McKenna Monahan led the Panthers with 15 points as sister Maddie and fellow guard Rachael Popp logged 13 and 12 points, respectively.

The good feelings of the road win were nearly washed away at home against Annandale, but another rally saved the day. After facing another second half deficit, the hosts turned up the intensity and the Cardinals were not able to match.

After trailing by seven points at the break, the Panthers roared to an 11-point lead late in the contest before settling for the nine-point win.

"The two biggest things that I thought were game changers in the second half were our shooting and defense," Otto-

Fisher said.

After shooting just 36 percent in the first half, the home side made 55 percent of their shots in the second frame.

"That really got us back in the game and allowed for the girls to shoot with confidence," Otto-Fisher said. "If they felt they were open, they were taking the shots. [Confidence] is what coaches love to see."

In addition to the secondhalf offense, Otto-Fisher's squad also upped the pressure on defense, forcing eight steals after halftime, as opposed to just two steals in the first half.

Maddie Monahan led GSL with 17 points. Popp scored 12 points and guard Madison Kalenberg had 10 points.

The Panthers are back in action on Friday, Jan. 23 at WCC West rival Mound Westonka before returning home to face Dassel-Cokato on Tuesday, Jan. 26.



Matmen win NLS tourney

A narrow defeat at home followed by an unanticipated tournament victory highlighted the efforts of the Glencoe-Silver Lake wrestling team last week.

Still coping with more than their share of injury and malaise, the Panthers hosted Wright County Conference foe Litchfield under the spotlight in their home arena on Tuesday, Jan. 13. In a tight battle that came down to the final match, the visiting Dragons came away with a 34-32 win.

"We wrestled hard, but had a couple guys out," coach Lance Wurm said. "Things didn't go our way, but we didn't give up."

GSL held an early 3-0 lead after Tanner Chmielewski claimed a 10-8 win over Ezra Kaping in the opening match at 106 pounds. However, the Panthers promptly fell behind 22-3 until Aaron Donnay's 11-2 major decision versus Logan Nelson at 138 halted the bleeding.

Brandon Richter's win by forfeit at 145 and Nate Tesch's prompt pinning of Dylan Penk at 152 drew the Panthers to within three points at 25-19. Litchfield claimed the next two matches to extend its advantage to 31-19 before the hosts began cutting the deficit yet again.

Nick Brelje's pinning of Andrew Schauer at 182 com-

bined with Tristan Weber's 17-7 major decision against Logan Wagner at 195 again pulled GSL tantalizingly close to its foe at 31-29.

But it was not to be.

Litchfield claimed an excruciatingly tight 2-1 win at 220 that gave the Dragons all the points they would need for victory.

Trailing 34-29, the Panthers required a pin from Christopher Lemke at 285 to snatch the team win. While the senior grappled valiantly to earn a 3-0 decision, Litchfield's Tristan Revering was able to evade the fall to send the visitors into the snowy night with a 34-32 triumph.

"It was a tough loss and not having our full lineup again hurt us." Wurm said. "But the kids are not getting beat down."

The team showed its resiliency three nights later in a trip north for the New London-Spicer invitational tournament. GSL, still shorthanded, put up one of its top combined efforts of the season in claiming the championship at the eight-team competition.

"I was very pleased with how we did," Wurm said. "I didn't think we could win with just 10 wrestlers. I was surprised."

The Panthers claimed five individual weight class titles



some wide open shots that holding through the second came off great looks. I didn't mind the shots we were taking, but the ball just wasn't falling through the rim."

DeCorsey noted his disappointment in the 73 points his team gave up. It is the team's stated goal to give up no more than 50-53 points to an opponent. The Panthers allowed just 35 points to New London-Spicer in a victory on Jan. 9.

Annandale's star forward, Chase Knickerbocker, led all scorers with 29 points. However, DeCorsey said that it was the Cardinals' other point earners that truly led the Panthers to defeat.

"Defensively, we weren't great," he said. "A player like Knickerbocker is generally going to get his points, but we can't allow guys that score 6-7 points a game to score 11 or 12 against us."

Offensively, three GSL players notched double-digit scoring nights. Guard Keaton Anderson led the way with 21 points, followed by 20 for backcourt mate Mason Goettl. Forward Jacob "Cubby" Popelka chipped in 16 points. Guard Teddy Peterson recorded six assists, with forward Garrett Ober hauling in nine rebounds.

The defeat came on the heels of a 54-46 win at Litchfield, a game in which DeCorsey described the Panthers as "being thrown into a food processor."

"You're going to play a lot of defense against Litchfield," he said. "There's screen after screen after screen. They have long possessions - generally 45 seconds or more - we were playing twice as much defense as they were."

GSL led 24-16 at the break, with that differential half as each team scored 30 post-halftime points en route to the Panthers' eight-point triumph.

"It was a big game for our bench," DeCorsey said. "Our starters were tired out from all the defense they were playing and our reserves came up big."

Forward Jon Richer led the reinforcements with seven points, scored in consecutive fashion as he carried the Panthers' scoring for a stretch. He also led his team with three assists.

A trio of Panthers - Anderson, Ober and Goettl each logged 10 points to share high score honors for the squad. Ober recorded team highs with nine rebounds and five blocks, Popelka had five rebounds. Dragons guard Cody Rau led all scorers with 16 points.

The .500 week left GSL with a 9-4 overall record and a 2-1 mark in the Wright County Conference's western division. Annandale leads the West with a 3-0 divisional tally to go with a 10-7 overall record.

Back from the road, the Panthers kicked off a threegame homestand against Holy Family on Tuesday, Jan. 20. GSL remains in the friendly confines of its own gymnasium for games against Jordan and Mound Westonka on Thursday and Friday night, respectively. The White Hawks entered the week tied with the Panthers with a 2-1 record in the WCC West.

"Jordan is a huge game for us. They are a good team and it's a section [opponent]," DeCorsey said. "Mound Westonka is in our half of the conference. It's a must win game - especially after losing to Annandale."





McLeod County Attorney Mike Junge issued summons last week to eight people involved in two late December police stings in Glencoe. Six were charged with selling alcohol to a 19-year-old, a gross misdemeanor punishable by up to a year in jail, a \$3,000 fine or both. ristians believe that we are saved by Jesus' suffering and death on the cross, in essence that he suffered and died for our sins. We consider Jesus' suffering to be sacred, as it is part and parcel of humanity's redemption. Jesus showed us that suffering can be sacred. That is not a cure or remedy for suffering, but a way to at least make it meaningful. It is sometimes said that human beings can live without anything except hope. We might also say that we can suffer anything as long as there is some meaning or purpose in it. As the philosopher Nietzsche put it, "He who has a why to live for can bear with almost any how." Nothing is worse than severe and interminable suffering that has no meaning. That might almost serve as a definition of Hell: severe and endless suffering that has no meaning. Imagine having the realization at the gates of Hell that we could have had salvation, but instead we chose selfishness, momentary pleasures and sin and now we are going to pay for it. That bargain, to sell one's soul for momentary pleasure or selfish gain, will undoubtedly appear meaningless in the grand scheme of things. Infinitely better to delay gratification and suffer meaningfully now than risk eternal meaningless suffering in the here-


Auntie Agnes Peters: Glencoe socialite

Agnes (Moravec) Peters was born in a bedroom on the Moravec farm three miles northwest of Glencoe in 1898. After graduating from the eighth grade at District 29 school, she helped around the farm and took part in live plays at the Biscay Hall, maybe like, "Annie Get Your Gun," "The Cherry Blossom Lady," "The Bohemian Girl," etc.

She then worked as a sales lady at the L.S. Preiss Store, where she worked with clerk Henry "Hap" Peters. It took Hap a few years to pop the question. They were married in 1929. Agnes was 31 years old. Their son Greg just recently passed away in 2014. In 1936, Hap became the Glencoe postmaster and Agnes became my godmother.

One of Agnes' sisters married a farmer and carried many five-gallon pails of water and feed uphill to the brooder house, milked cows by hand and cleaned the chicken coop. Another sister married a lawyer who became a U.S. Congressman, but died after giving birth to her second child. Another sister married a farmer and died giving birth to her fifth child. Another sister moved to Minneapolis and had nine children.

To me, Agnes and Hap were a perfect "Ozzie and Harriet" family. Then tragedy struck! Hap had a stroke and died at age 52. Agnes moved



and took care of her aging parents and they soon died. Her son Greg joined the Navy and was gone for 15 years. Her hearing went bad.

She then worked in the hospital and finally at Doug's Music Store, where she learned to play the organ. She obtained her driver's license at age 65.

She made the best of things and took part in the Glencoe social life, always had a smiley upbeat attitude, was friendly to everyone, was very religious, volunteered countless hours at the St. George Church and played the organ there. She belonged to civic organizations, enjoyed card parties, especially the KWIZ Card Club. She enjoyed meeting people and was always on the "go." She bought a home in the Glencoe Horseshoe area and spent her last years at Millie Manor, where she could still beat out a polka on her organ at age 96. Agnes died at age 99. Her farmer sister died at age 98.

Auntie Agnes kept a diary for 20 years, starting at age 72 in 1970 and stopping at age 92 in 1990. She had perfect handwriting until the



end; wrote in ink and never made a spelling mistake or crossed out words.

I was lucky enough to obtain her 13 diary books; all neatly bound in three-ring binders and narrowed the 130 pages down to eight and now have to reduce that to two pages.

I hope Auntie Agnes will forgive me for printing some parts of her diary. She did such a remarkable job! It tells about her life, Glencoe activities, and proves getting old is not easy. Full copies are available.

1970 (age 72): Father Bonin and I went to St. Cloud to buy church fabric. 1971 (age 73): My niece Millie died. 1972 (age 74): My sister Josie, age 86, passed away. Clean bill of health on my physical; cost \$64. 1973 (age 75): Jim Portele's funeral; 28 priests plus the bishop attended. 1974 (age 76): Went to Father Robert Mraz's ordination. Father Zwicky is the priest at St. George. Nixon is pardoned. 1975 (age 77): Haukos Trailer Park was hit by a tornado. Sewed new elastic in four panties. Danced at the Seniors Dance. 1976 (age 78): Eight funerals. Watched TV while Glencoe couple (Susan Lorence) wins a car and a washer and dryer on "The Price is Right." Had eye surgery. Watched Mondale/Dole debate on TV. 1977 (age 79): Leo Dietz died. I skidded my car; rolled over, totaled the car. I only have a few bruises. 1978 (age 80): Bought a 1973 Vega for \$1,995. Got a 50-cent parking ticket downtown Glencoe. Sold my house; moving to Millie Manor. Disaster: motor is shot on the Vega; Beneke fixed it for \$175. 1979 (age 81): Father Zwicky gave my sister Clara the Last Rites; Clara snapped out of her illness. Pope John Paul is in Poland. The people just love him! Car makes noise; sold it for \$450; never did like that Vega! I have a backache. 1980 (age 82): Father Zwicky's farewell party. Father Dvorak will replace him. Rent is now \$113 a month at the Manor. Made myself chicken livers and gravy for supper. Bruce Bradley and Jerry Dostal played at the Seniors Dance. Watched, "Who Shot J.R.?" on TV. (Continued next week).



It'll be another mostly quiet week for the upper Midwest as we head toward the second half of January. Average highs for this time of year are typically in the mid 20s, and for the most part we'll be just above that during this forecast period.

A weak (but pesky) ridge of high pressure has set up over the west coast, keeping us in a northwestern flow. If the ridge was stronger we'd be in danger of letting more cold air in, but at this stage it doesn't look like that'll be the scenario that wins out. Highs will range from the mid 20s to low 30s this week, depending on how weak impulses alter things. There are no whopper-type storms, but in this type of pattern we'll deal with quick-moving moisture-starved systems capable of dropping a nuisance amount of snow. We'll see snow chances Friday (this one is pointed more to our north), Saturday and again Sunday, with Sunday being the best chance of seeing more than a dusting to an inch.

The long range keeps the coldest air well to our north, so hopefully this type of pattern continues to win out. Have a great week, all!

Thursday — Highs 22-28, lows 13-19; partly cloudy. Friday — Highs 29-35, lows 20-26; clouds/snow showers (north).

Saturday — Highs 25-31, lows 15-21; clouds/flurries.

Sunday — Highs 26-33; clouds/snow (dusting or a few inches?).

Answer to last week's question (What is the coldest temperature ever recorded in Minnesota, the United States and the world?): Minnesota's coldest temperature was -60 degrees in Embarrass (Feb. 2, 1996), for the United States it was -80 At Prospect Creek, Alaska (Jan. 23, 1971), and the coldest temperature recorded on the entire planet was -128.6 degrees at the Soviet Vostok Station in Antarctica (July 21, 1983).


