It's a whole new ballgame in CRVL

For at least the next two seasons, the Crow River Valley League (CRVL) will play baseball in a three-division format under a proposal that was ratified in mid-December's league meeting.

The CRVL will expand from a north/south division format to three divisions -West, Central and North – featuring five teams apiece determined by geographical loca-

"For a majority of teams in the league, it was something that they wanted," Glencoe Brewers manager Stephen Wiblemo said. "This particular scenario wasn't our top choice, but I'm not too upset about it."

In the new alignment, the Brewers move from the CRVL North - which they shared with Winsted, Waconia, Watertown, New Germany, Mayer and St. Boni and into the CRVL West.

The new CRVL West features the Brewers, the Hamburg Hawks, Brownton Bruins, Plato Blue Jays and Green Isle Irish. The latter two teams faced one another in the 2015 Class C State Tournament

championship game. Hamburg was also a state qualifier.

"I was all for realignment, but was not in favor of this scenario," Plato manager Adam Dammann said.

Dammann noted that the lack of competitive balance in the former divisions made realignment the right thing to do, but that "while breaking up into three divisions is good for the league, the way it was broken up was not good.

"Between this plan and just keeping things as they were, I would have preferred to keep the old alignment. There were at least six other scenarios that we believe would have worked better - not only for us, but for the league as a whole."

As it happened, the realignment plan passed on a 4-3 vote among teams formerly of the North and 6-2 among teams from the former South. Though for different reasons, Brownton joined Plato in voicing displeasure over the new alignment.

"It was a case of something that was not broken, so why try to fix it?" Bruins manager Doug Schuette said. "I guess maybe (the former alignment) was an issue with some teams,

but it was not with us.'

Brownton, and Glencoe noted that the new format break ups of some of the traditional rivalries built up over the past eight years.

"We would have preferred to maintain our past rivalries with teams such as Winsted and Watertown," Wiblemo said. "We are the only former North team in our new division – it's going to be all new rivalries."

The majority of Glencoe's former CRVL North rivals -Winsted Wildcats, Watertown Red Devils, New Germany Dutchmen, Mayer Blazers and St. Boni Saints – remain in the new northern division.

The other team formerly of the North - the Waconia Wildcats - move to the CRVL Central, where they join former southern division teams Norwood Indians, Young America Cardinals, Cologne Hollanders and Carver Black Sox. Those southern division teams all used to be aligned with Brownton and Plato.

Based on a quick look at last year's standings alone, the new alignment appears to cre-

GSL winless at Tartan tourney

It wasn't the kindest of holiday seasons for the Glencoe-Silver Lake boys' basketball team. The Panthers' losing streak hit four games after GSL went winless in a trio of matchups at the Tartan Holiday Tournament last week.

After dropping the tourney opener by a 69-26 score to Forest Lake on Monday, Dec. 28, the Panthers lost 72-29 to Spring Lake Park and 80-69 to Centennial on Dec. 29-30.

"Spring Lake Park (SLP) is big and strong - it's basically their football team," coach Robb DeCorsey said. "We were just throwing shots up, running back into our zone with our tail between our legs and then not defending."

GSL allowed SLP 12 three-point baskets in the game, while only recording 12 field goals in general itself. Guards Mason Ahlbrecht and Tyler Ehrke led the Panthers with a scant six points apiece. Forward Jacob Popelka missed the game due to an urgent family matter.

"If it wasn't for Mason battling and basically putting up a one-man press that he scored a few baskets off of, we don't even score 29 points," DeCorsey said.

Popelka returned for the tournament finale - a game that saw GSL set a new season high for points with 69. Unfortunately, the Panthers also posted a new record for points allowed in a contest with 80.

At least we scored, whereas didn't first two games. But we didn't defend at all - didn't resist," DeCorsey said. We scored on a team that doesn't play very good defense, then didn't play any defense ourselves. Those are kind of deceiving numbers in the final score."

Popelka led GSL with 14 points, with Frahm netting 13 points and guard Shane Ehrke chipping in with 10 points.

As the losses mount, the Panthers continue to search for answers. By the end of this week, the 2015-16 regular-season campaign will hit its halfway point and DeCorsey said

"we have got a lot of work to do." "We're not doing enough on defense and just don't have the mentality to be tough," he said. "Guys are looking at each other out there. They don't know what to do. We can't score and quickly retreat into a 'woe is me' mindset. I thought we'd be much better by this point."

One factor that could make the season to come more optimistic than the schedule that has passed is the return of guard Teddy Petersen.

Panthers win holiday tournament at Hayfield

It was a happy holidays indeed for

the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' basketball team as the Panthers earned their first hardware of the season by winning the Hayfield Tournament. GSL ran its winning streak to three games with a pair of wins in Hayfield and hit a high water mark on the season with a 6-4 record.

Following up on a 44-34 defeat of Jordan on Tuesday, Dec. 22, the Panthers handed Caledonia just its second loss of the season with a 58-49 win in the tournament opener on Tuesday, Dec. 29. GSL came out of the gates hot, putting up a 35-22 halftime lead before cruising to the ninepoint win.

Guard Maddie Monahan led all scorers with 21 points and also had a team-high four steals; guard Rachael Popp chipped in with nine points.

Guard Mac Monahan and forward Maddy Kalenberg scored eight points apiece, with Kalenberg hauling in 14 total rebounds - with nine of those coming on the defensive end.

The next night, the Panthers finished off their tournament sweep by defeating host Hayfield 54-51 - ending the Vikings' four-game winning streak in the process. The game was tight throughout, with GSL coming out on top in the hotly-contested matchup.

Maddie Monahan - who had a team-high seven assists and five steals - again led all scorers with 21 points. Mac Monahan put up 11 points and Popp recorded nine points. Kalenberg again notched double-digit rebounds with 10 boards, evenly dispersed with five on each end of the court.

West while leaving the other two divisions still contending with competitive imbalances.

Hamburg, which still qualified for state, is the only West team to have sported a sub-.500 regular season record in 2015. Contrast that with the new Central and North divisions, each of which have three teams that finished below .500 during last year's regular sea-

"Are we in the toughest division? Yes. I don't think anyone would argue that," Wiblemo

Schuette agreed, noting that while the Bruins "have no problem being in a very competitive division," the new alignment "definitely does not fix competitive balance."

Under the new format, teams will play each division rival twice with one game against non-divisional CRVL squads.

The new format also decreases the number of league games from 20 for old northern division and 21 for former southern division clubs to 18 contests for all league squads.

Wiblemo and Dammann said they were in favor of fewer league games in order to play against more varied non-CRVL competition, Schuette said he would have rather kept his team's 21-game league

ate one "super division" in the vision, league teams will be seeded at the end of the regular season.

> The top seeded team will receive an automatic bye for the first round of the playoffs. The next 14 teams will face off in a best-of-three series in which the No. 2 seed plays No. 15, No. 3 plays No. 14, etc.

The top seed and seven firstround playoff survivors then advance to the eight-team regional tournament, which will still be played in a doubleelimination format to determine state qualifiers.

Dammann noted that with the apparent divisional imbalances, the team that emerges from the regular season with the CRVL's top overall record may not be the "true" No. 1 despite how the seeds shake

"With the West as competitive as it is, our division's top team might not have as good of a record as the top team from a less competitive division," he said. "That could put a bit of a damper on certain teams.'

This new regular-season and playoff system will remain in effect for at least 2016 and 2017, after which the format will be reviewed before its possible use in 2018 and beyond.

"It's a two-vear trial." Schuette said. "But once you go away from something, it is hard to go back."

GSL alum Ober has December to remember

BROOKINGS, S.D.-Glencoe-Silver Lake High School alumna Clarissa Ober, a junior forward on the South Dakota State University women's basketball team, helped the program turn in a December to remember.

The Jackrabbits posted a 6-1 record in December and opens Summit League play Wednesday after posting a 10-3 nonconference record.

The Jacks' wins came over Portland State (Dec. 3), Northern Colorado (Dec. 5), Northern Iowa (Dec. 9), Creighton (Dec. 12), then-No. 16 DePaul (Dec. 15), and Bowling Green (Dec.

Their lone loss was on the road at Green Bay (Dec. 19).

Ober, a 6-foot-2 center, has started all 13 games and is averaging 8.1 points, 8.2 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game. She is also shooting 40 percent from the floor, 34.8 percent from 3-point range and 69.4 percent from the foul line. Ober leads the team and is fourth in The Summit League in rebounds. She is also third in the league in blocks.

Ober, who leads The Summit League in double-doubles with four, collected a pair in back-to-back games and three in December.

Against Portland State, she

registered 19 points, a career-high 13 rebounds and 3 blocks. Two days later, she scored 12 points and grabbed 10 rebounds vs. Colorado State.

Her two-game performance earned her Summit League Player of the Week honors for the first time in

In the upset win over then-No. 16 DePaul, Ober was 5 of 9 from the field and 4 of 6 from the foul line to tally 15 points. She also snared 10 boards.

At Creighton, Ober had nine points, seven rebounds, a career-best five assists and two blocks.

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



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

Saturday - Highs 20s, falling quickly in evening to below zero; early flurries, clouds.

Sunday — Highs -5 to 3; partly cloudy.

Weather Quiz: Is the crazy weather we're seeing around the country normal for an El Nino year?

Answer to last week's question (What does the longterm forecast look like for January?): The long-term forecast shows our colder weather hanging on, but not anything too drastic. The coldest air in the Arctic is about 15-20 degrees warmer this year than normal, so even if chunks break off and head our way it won't be as bad as
