"I'll throw shot put, but there are other throwing events in college that aren't in high school such as hammer throw, weight throw, and javelin," she said. "I'll be able


Christensen visited Bemidji twice this autumn. She said she chose BSU due to the school having a good program in criminal justice, a major she wishes to pursue, as well


"Even though (Bemidji) is a bigger city, you still get that small town sort of vibe where everyone knows everyone just like here in Glencoe."

Artists are prohibited from using any photographic or other electronic product as part of their finished entries. Winning artists may issue limited edition prints of the artwork and retain proceeds.

Final judging is open to the public and will take place at 2 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 21, at DNR headquarters, 500 Lafayette Road, in St. Paul. The public is welcome to come and view the winning design 10 a.m. to noon on Friday, Dec. 22.

Revenue from stamp sales is dedicated to wild turkey habitat management. Extirpated from Minnesota around 1900, wild turkeys now thrive throughout nearly all of Minnesota but the extreme northern forested portions of the state.

am writing this cover on Sunday moring, November 5. After Masses, religious education and a meeting I will be heading out on vacation. I spent last evening doing laundry and packing for my trip. I have checked, re-checked and checked my luggage again to make sure that I have what I need on vacation. Unlike travel experts, I do not spend a lot of time worrying about limiting how much I pack, rather I try to take both the clothes, personal items and work I need during my trip. Before leaving I will rummage through my luggage to make sure that I have my passport, money, wallet, and checkbook. It may be fear, caution, worry or pehaps wisdom, but I think I have everything that I need for my trip.

This weekend's Gospel presents us with a parable of 10 virgins waiting to greet the wedding groom when he arrives. Five are wise and five are foolish. 




