

Christensen signs with Bemidji State

Glencoe-Silver Lake senior Zoe Christensen, fresh off being named to the All-Wright County Conference West Team for girls' soccer, made a big decision on her future last week.

Christensen, a two-time state participant in the shot put, signed a letter of intent to attend Bemidji State University beginning next fall and compete in track and field for the Beavers.

Surrounded by friends and family, Christensen put pen to paper to commit to BSU in a ceremony at GSL on Friday, Nov. 10. She said it is a good feeling to have the decision made.

"It is a huge relief to have my plans set for college. Now when people ask me what I'm doing after high school, I will finally have an answer," she said. "I'm glad I have the opportunity to be apart of an awesome team and get a great education at the same time. I can't wait to compete as a Bemidji State Beaver."

Christensen plans to continue throwing for the BSU track and field team. She noted that she is excited to try out some different events that are offered at the collegiate level.

"I'll throw shot put, but there are other throwing events in college that aren't in high school such as hammer throw, weight throw, and javelin," she said. "I'll be able

to try all of these new events."

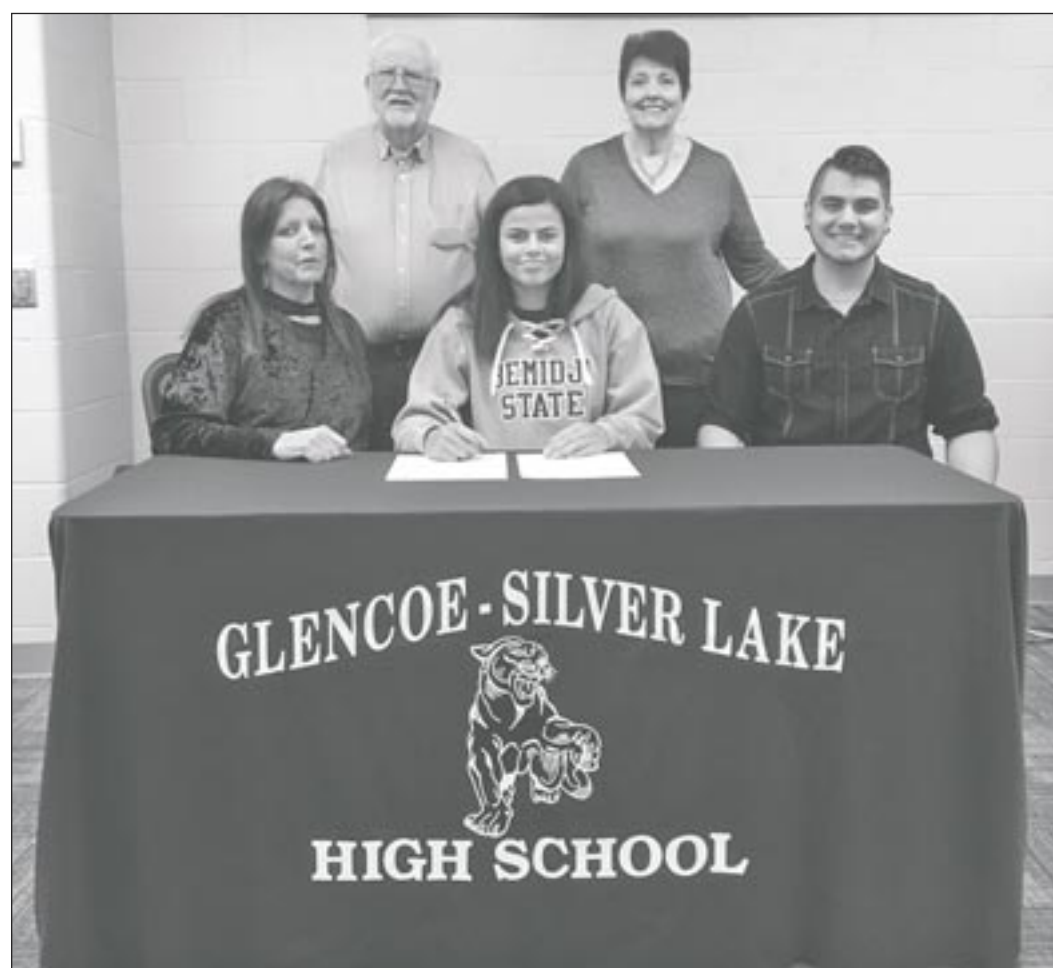
Christensen visited Bemidji twice this autumn. She said she chose BSU due to the school having a good program in criminal justice, a major she wishes to pursue, as well as the feel of the school and town of Bemidji.

"The first time I stepped foot on the campus I knew that I was going to fall in love with it," she said. "I mean, a campus right on a lake? What more could someone want? Bemidji State has a very simple yet beautiful campus."

"Even though (Bemidji) is a bigger city, you still get that small town sort of vibe where everyone knows everyone just like here in Glencoe."

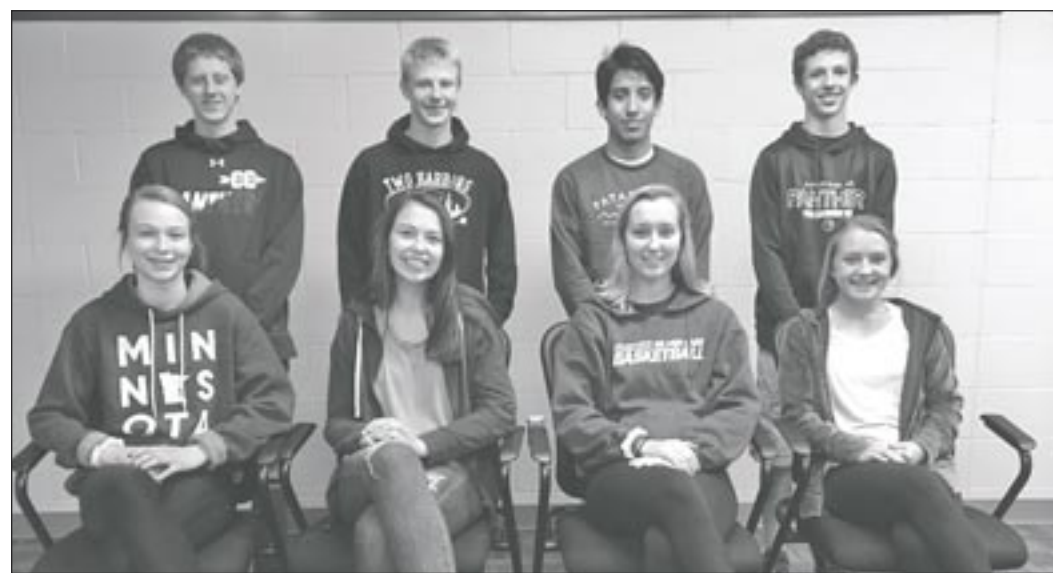

From the four-time defending conference champion GSL volleyball squad, middle hitter Rhyan Herrmann joined outside hitters Kasidy Cacka and McKenna Monahan on the all-WCC team. Middle hitter Mickalyn Frahm and setter Lexi Hansch claimed spots on

the Honorable Mention squad.

The WCC West champion GSL boys' cross-country team netted three All-Conference honorees in Tony Fischer, Jakob Rusten and Connor Holloway; three more claimed Honorable Mention slots in Oscar Pena, AJ Anderson-Sanchez

and Paul Sievert.

GSL girls' cross-country had one All-Conference runner in Maddie Lemke, as well as three more Honorable Mention members in Malayh Metcalf, Megan Siewert and Ellie Schmidt.

DNR seeking designs for 2019 turkey stamp

Wildlife artists can submit entries for the 2019 Minnesota Wild Turkey Stamp from Monday, Dec. 4, through 4 p.m., Friday, Dec. 15.

The cost of a turkey stamp

is included in a turkey license, but pictorial stamps are sold as collectables. In the contest, the eastern wild turkey must be the primary focus of the design.

Artists are prohibited from using any photographic or other electronic product as part of their finished entries. Winning artists may issue limited edition prints of the artwork and retain proceeds.

Final judging is open to the public and will take place at 2 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 21, at DNR headquarters, 500 Lafayette Road, in St. Paul. The public is welcome to come and view the winning design 10 a.m. to noon on Friday, Dec. 22.

Revenue from stamp sales is dedicated to wild turkey habitat management. Extirpated from Minnesota around 1900, wild turkeys now thrive throughout nearly all of Minnesota but the extreme northern forested portions of the state.

Do I Have Everything?

I am writing this cover on Sunday morning, November 5. After Masses, religious education and a meeting I will be heading out on vacation. I spent last evening doing laundry and packing for my trip. I have checked, re-checked and checked my luggage again to make sure that I have what I need on vacation. Unlike travel experts, I do not spend a lot of time worrying about limiting how much I pack, rather I try to take both the clothes, personal items and work I need during my trip. Before leaving I will rummage through my luggage to make sure that I have my passport, money, wallet, and checkbook. It may be fear, caution, worry or perhaps wisdom, but I think I have everything that I need for my trip.

This weekend's Gospel presents us with a parable of 10 virgins waiting to greet the wedding groom when he arrives. Five are wise and five are foolish. The wise virgins bring all they need and more so that whatever happens they will be ready when he arrives. The foolish virgins trust schedules and promptness and bring only what they think they might need. When things are delayed, the foolish do not have what they need, leave to get it and are barred from the celebration. Jesus reminds us that entrance into his glory demands preparation and vigilance. Life is uncertain, and we must be prepared through grace to receive that Lord whenever he comes. This message is not meant to make us paranoid or afraid, but a sober reminder that our lives are to be a constant witness to our faith. If we heed the Lord's call, live in mutual love and care and long for his coming, we will be received with joy.

This last week brought us the first snow and real cold of the season. We all checked our furnaces, got out our winter coats, boots, gloves and hats. We found the ice scrapers and brushes we packed away last spring and got them into our cars for the winter. We made sure that our ice-melt and snowshovels were handy. Most of us, although somewhat unwillingly, are ready for the coming of winter. These everyday routines can become reminders to prepare our lives for the coming of the Lord. We can renew our faith and deepen our devotion to the Lord. If we have packed away our dedication, we can get it out of storage and renew it. We clothe our lives in faith, hope and love. We can scrape away the ice and snow that can cover our hearts and bring them to the Lord. Finally we can renew our commitment to live, not just profess, our faith.

We may not know the hour or the day in which the Lord will come, but wisdom can guide us into a way of life that will be ready at any moment to receive him and rejoice with him when he comes.

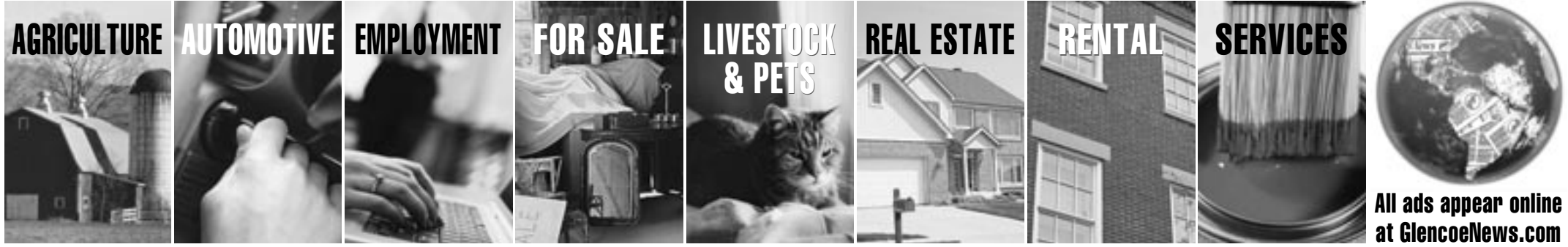

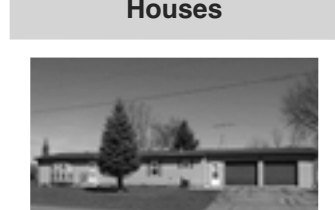

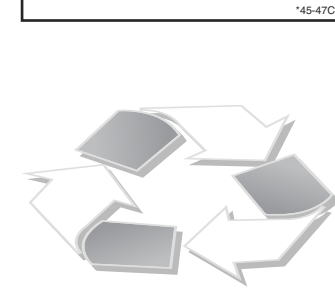
