Girls' cross-country team takes 13th at state

Making the program's first appearance at state in 14 years, the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' cross-country team took 13th overall on a damp, brisk afternoon at St. Olaf College in Northfield on Saturday, Nov. 3.

"State was a great experience for all of the girls," coach Josh Metcalf said. "A great way to end the season."

The seven members of the Panthers' squad that secured the team's first state berth since 2004 by finishing as the championship meet all competed on the course that winds around the trails to the north and west of the college.

Bursting from the line for

the 3.1-mile run, all seven were among the 175 runners to finish the race.

When the final totals were tallied, GSL came in 13th with 281 points.

The Panthers were just four points behind Belle Plaine, the team that won the Section 2A title in Montgomery on Thursday, Oct. 25.

As it was at the 2A compeition, freshman Kendall runner-up in the Section 2A Guerrero led GSL at state. said coach Metcalf.

The freshman finished 35th overall with a time of 20 minutes, 16.8 seconds.

Senior Maddy Lemke was next, placing 43rd in 20:34.2, followed by freshman Malayh Metcalf in 59th at 21:14.1 and junior Megan Siewert in 61st at 21:15.6.

Abigale Boetel ran a personal best time at the meet, taking 83rd in 21:53.8, to secure the Panthers' final points.

Kianna Dolezal placed 98th in 22:32.5 and Majkya Metcalf was 104th in 22:50.9.

ending the Panthers' season. It began as a night of opti-

mism for GSL, as the Panthers seized and early lead in the first set and held NYA at arm's length in a 25-20 victo-

Sets 2 and 3 both began with GSL taking a 2-0 lead, but both also ended similarly, with the Raiders powering back to win 25-19 and 25-17, respectively.

"We came out on fire and then I felt a sigh of relief after the first set," coach Lori Schwirtz said. "Instead of continuing to chase a dream we just deflated a little bit."

NYA began to show its swagger in the fourth and

final set. The Raiders took an eightpoint lead, which was briefly sliced to 20-17 by GSL before NYA took the last five points of the night to win 25-17 and end the Panthers' season.

Middle hitter Rhyan Herrmann led GSL with 20 kills and 23 digs in her final high school match.

Fellow senior hitter Kasidy Cacka had nine kills, as did junior front-liner Miah Monahan. Junior setter Hannah Boesche had a team-best 36 assists.


The Panthers finished the season with a 26-7 record.




Hallaway makes inaugural state run



6 And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. And they prayed and said, 'You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles" (Acts 1: 23-26).

When the apostles chose who would replace Judas Iscariot, they did not do so haphazardly. 




