

## Gymnasts open with split of first two meets

A pair of performances that netted over 120 points were good enough for a split of the first two meets of the season for the Glencoe-Silver Lake gymnastics team.

The Panthers began their 2017-18 campaign in winning fashion at Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted on Tuesday, Dec. 19.

Led by Gia Venier and Marissa Greeley, who finished 1-2 in the individual all-around competition, GSL earned the team win with 121.325 points to 117.150 for the Lakers.

Venier won the all-around with a total score of 31.375.

She was first on vault at 8.5 and uneven bars at 7.325, while finishing second in floor exercise at 8.2 and fifth on balance beam at 7.35.

Greeley was second in the all-around with a 31.150. She won the floor exercise with an 8.5, took second on vault at 8.3 and was fifth on bars at 6.9.

Breana Templin made it a clean sweep of all four events by winning the beam competition with a score of 8.05.

Buyoed by a third-place score of 7.050 on bars, Mikayla Wigern took fifth in the all-around with a 29.55.

Two nights later at Annandale, GSL bumped its score up to 123.7, but finished sec-

ond to the Cardinals' team tally of 133.2.

Venier placed third in the all-around with a score of 32.15, with Greeley fourth at 31.8 and Wigern fifth at 30.175.

The Panthers swept the top three placed on vault. Venier was first at 9.05, followed by Greeley in second at 8.9 and Wigern in third at 8.85.

Greeley recorded an 8.45 to take third on floor; Venier placed fourth on bars at 7.5, as did Templin on Beam with an 8.0.

GSL is currently off for the holiday break. The Panthers are scheduled to return to competition at home against Orono on Thursday, Jan. 4.

## Girls' hoops up record to 5-1 with win at GFW

By handing Gibbon-Fairfax-Winthrop its first loss of the season in its lone game last week, the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' basketball team assured itself of a winning record entering 2018.

The Panthers went up early on the host Thunderbirds, leading 42-27 at halftime, before cruising to a 71-56 victory to improve to 5-1 on the year.

Once again, guard Mac Monahan led the way with a game-high 31 points. Guard Miah Monahan registered 16 points, with forward Zoe Christensen chipping in 12 points in the winning effort.

Mac Monahan headed into the holiday break as the

team's leading scorer with an average of 27.3 points per game. Miah Monahan is averaging 14.5 ppg, with fellow guard Olivia Lemke averaging 13.2 ppg. Those three, in order, also lead the team in assists with an average of 4.3, 3.7 and 1.3 per game, respectively.

Forward Mickalyn Frahm leads GSL with an average of 4.3 rebounds per game, followed by Christensen at 4.0 rpg and Miah Monahan at 3.7 per game.

The Panthers will stay home for the holidays, eschewing the Hayfield Tournament to host their own four-team competition on Wednesday and Thursday.

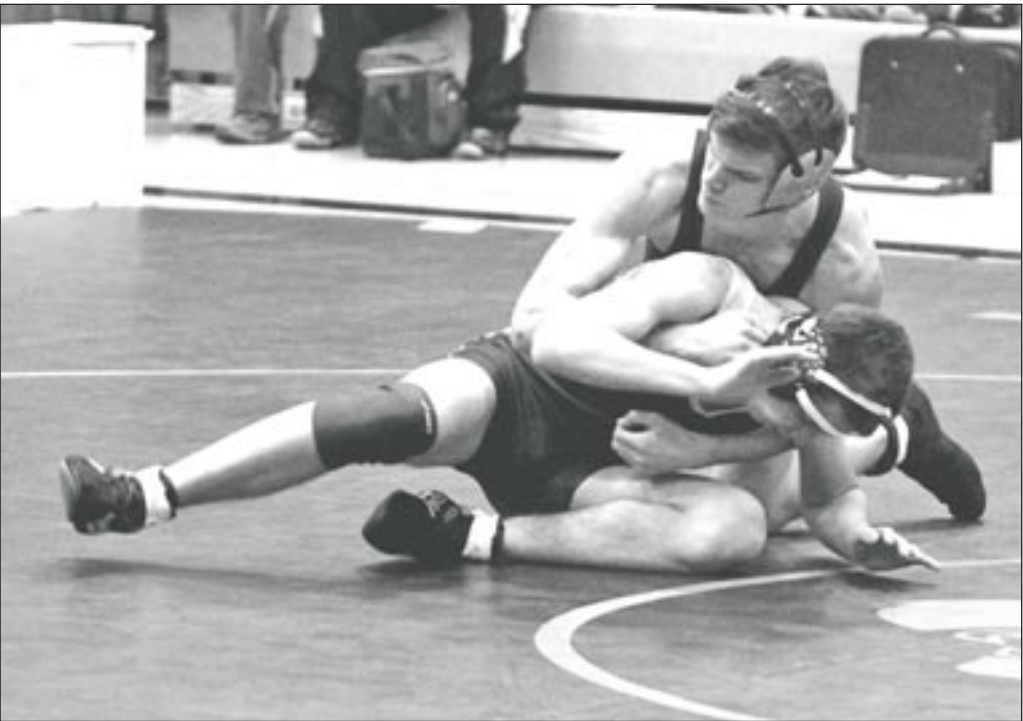
## Grapplers split double dual at Dassel-Cokato

# Losing skid hits three games for boys' hoopsters

After starting out the season with a 3-0 record, the Glencoe-Silver Lake boys' basketball team has dropped back to .500.

The Panthers lost both of their contests last week and took a three-game losing streak into the holiday break.

GSL suffered its most lopsided loss of the year in an 80-58 loss at Mayer Lutheran on Tuesday, Dec. 19.

Guard Dane Schwirtz led the Panthers with 17 points, with forwards Kyle Christensen and Gage Alsleben recording 11 and 10 points, respectively.

The loss marked just the third time in the past five seasons in which GSL has allowed an opponent 80 or more points.

The Panthers followed up that road loss with another, falling 62-51 at Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted on Thursday, Dec. 21. Individual statistics were not available.

GSL has allowed opponents an average of 65.3

points while scoring 51.3 points in its three losses, after allowing opponents an average of just 52 points while scoring 64 points over its season-opening three-game winning streak.

The Panthers return to action on Wednesday night when the squad hosts its four-team holiday tournament. GSL takes on Lester Prairie/Holy Trinity at 8 p.m. to cap a day full of varsity and junior varsity basketball in both the Black and Purple gymnasiums.

A win on Wednesday night puts the Panthers in the tournament title game against either Belle Plaine or Holy Family Catholic on Thursday night. A loss in the tournament opener has GSL playing either the Tigers or Fire in the third-place game Thursday afternoon.

Following the holiday tourney, the Panthers return to their regular-season schedule at Jordan on Tuesday in the first game of a three-game road trip. GSL will not return home until Tuesday, Jan. 16 against Watertown-Mayer.

The varsity and junior varsity teams will play tourney games in both the Purple and Black gymnasiums.

GSL will take on Maple Lake in its tournament opener at 6 p.m. Wednesday evening after BOLD plays Roseville's Concordia Academy in the afternoon contest.

A win on Wednesday will have the Panthers playing either BOLD or Concordia

in the tournament title game on Thursday evening. A loss will have GSL playing the other semifinal loser in the third-place game on Thursday afternoon.

The Panthers will return to their regular-season schedule with a game at Jordan at 6 p.m. Tuesday night in the opener of a four-game road trip. GSL remains on the road until Friday, Jan. 12, against Litchfield.

However, it was all Lightning from there. Annandale/Maple Lake won seven of the next eight matches by fall before taking the final two by forfeit to claim a sizable victory.

The Panthers fared far better in the follow-up, building a 29-0 lead en route to winning by 14 points.

Dawson Varpness (106), Ruschmeier (113) and Sawyer Varpness (120) were all awarded wins by forfeit to put GSL/LP up 18-0 right away.

Voelz claimed a win by fall at 126, with Carter Ziegler earning a 15-0 technical fall victory at 132 to put the Panthers up big be-

fore the Raiders rallied.

NYA won the next four matches, three by fall, to pull to within 29-21 before Theo Luciano (170) and Cody Rae (182) both won by fall to give GSL/LP an insurmountable 41-21 edge.

Zach Wanous claimed the Panthers' final points of the night on a forfeit before NYA won the final two matches on a fall and a forfeit to close out the dual with a GSL/LP win.

The Panthers are now off until Thursday, Jan. 4, when they are scheduled to host a triangular meet against Mankato East and Waterville-Elysian-Morristown.

# Lions' clubs announce local write-off contest winners

District 5M-2 of the International Association of Lions' Clubs annually sponsors an essay contest known as the District 5M-2 Write Off Contest. This contest is open to all students grades nine through 12 in the district's 12-county area.

Additional cash awards will be available to her, as she will present her essay at the 5M-2 District Convention on Feb. 10, 2018, at Mankato.

# Start the new year with fresh air and physical activity on a First Day Hike

First day hikes will take place at 14 Minnesota state parks on Monday, Jan. 1, as part of a nationwide effort, led by America's state parks, to promote starting the new year with fresh air and physical activity. More than 400 hikes are scheduled this year in all 50 states.

Minnesota's events include five daytime hikes,

four snowshoe hikes, three full moon hikes. First day hikes are free.

People should dress for the weather, so ideally in layers that can shed when they warm up as they get moving. They may also want to bring a light backpack to store a water bottle, a nutritious snack, binoculars, a camera, and those extra layers of clothing.

A vehicle permit (\$7 for a one-day permit or \$35 for a year-round permit) is also required to enter Minnesota state parks.

# Minn. DNR announces new special angling regulations

Special fishing regulations will change March 1 on a number of Minnesota waters following an annual public input and review process, according to the Department of Natural Resources.

"Anglers need to know special regulations because they take precedence over statewide regulations," said Al Stevens, fisheries program consultant with the DNR. "We have special regulations to improve fish

populations and make fishing better or more sustainable."

Special regulations for individual waters are listed in a separate section of the Minnesota Fishing Regulations booklet and at mndnr.gov/fishmn, and are posted at public accesses.

For this spring, new statewide northern pike zone regulations that take effect on inland waters will make it possible to do away with several previously ex-

isting special regulations that apply to individual waters and aim for similar outcomes as the zone regulations. The new statewide pike regulations go into effect in time for the fishing opener on Saturday, May 12.

On waters that have a special fishing regulation, anglers are required to follow the special regulation and unless otherwise mentioned, all other regulations apply.



# Pastor's Corner



## A Thrill of Hope

*Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. Luke 2:11*

Reginald Fessenden had been working for years to achieve wireless radio communication. Other scientists found his ideas radical and unorthodox, and doubted he would succeed. But he claims that on December 24, 1906, he became the first person to ever play music over the radio.

Fessenden held a contract with a fruit company which had installed wireless systems on roughly a dozen boats to communicate about the harvesting and marketing of bananas. That Christmas Eve, Fessenden said that he told the wireless operators on board all ships to pay attention. At 9 o'clock they heard his voice.

Without Christ there is no hope. Charles Spurgeon

He reportedly played a record of an operatic aria, and then he pulled out his violin, playing "O Holy Night" and singing the words to the last verse as he played. Finally, he offered Christmas greetings and read from Luke 2 the story of angels announcing the birth of a Savior to shepherds in Bethlehem.

Both the shepherds in Bethlehem over two thousand years ago and the sailors on board the United Fruit Company ships in 1906 heard an unexpected, surprising message of hope on a dark night. And God still speaks that same message of hope to us today. A Savior has been born for us—Christ the Lord! (Luke 2:11). We can join the choir of angels and believers through the ages who respond with "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests" (v. 14).

BRRRRRRR!!! I know it's Minnesota and I've lived here my entire life, but it's still a shock to the system when we get the kind of temperatures we've had since Sunday. A pool of arctic air has settled over the Midwest and by the way things look it won't work out of the area until at least early next week. Highs for the most part have hovered on either side of 0 with lows well below zero and wind chills to 40 and 50 below up north.
