Over 200 youth wrestlers from kindergarten through eighth-grade hit the mat for the Glencoe-Silver Lake/Lester Prairie Youth Wrestling Tournament at Lester Prairie High School on Saturday, March 12.

The competition was a district qualifier for the Northland Youth Wrestling Association's Region 3 Tournament, scheduled to be held at Lakeville North High School on Saturday, March 19.

Kindergarten – Dreyden Voigt, second; Cade Heimerl, second; Zach Dye, fourth.

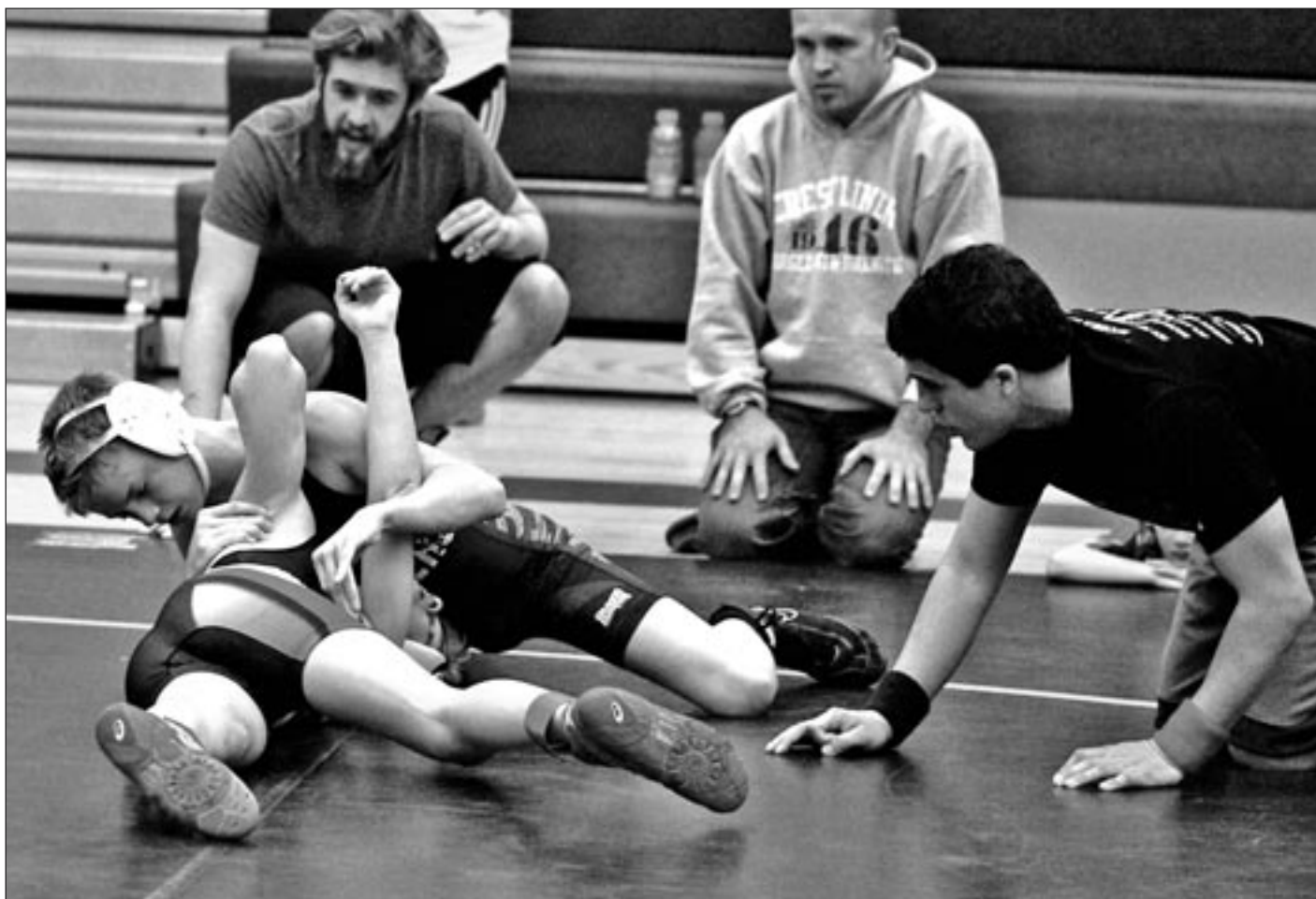

Ober, SDSU are going dancing in NCAA tourney

Glencoe-Silver Lake alumna Clarissa Ober is going dancing this weekend in California, along with her South Dakota State University (SDSU) women’s basketball teammates.

On Monday, March 14, the Jackrabbits were awarded the No. 12 seed in the Lexington Region of the NCAA Women’s Basketball Championship tournament after a 26-6 regular season.

SDSU will face fifth-seeded Miami in an opening-round game on Saturday, March 19 at the Maples Pavilion in Palo Alto, California.

It will be the first-ever meeting between the Jackrabbits and Miami.

Saturday’s victor will advance to take on either No. 4 Stanford or No. 13 San Francisco in a second-round game.

South Dakota State (26-6) completed its 10th 20-win season in the last 12 years and makes its seventh appearance in the NCAA Championship. The Jacks are 1-6 in the championship and 2016 is the first time the Jackrabbits earned the No. 12 seed. SDSU’s highest seed came as the seventh seed in the 2009 NCAA Tournament. The Jackrabbits have been No. 13 twice, No. 14 twice and No. 15.

Ober, a junior center for the Jackrabbits finished the Summit League season second in blocks per game (2.3) and blocks (33), while also ranking fifth in rebounds (8.3), including fifth in defensive rebounds (5.5) per game.

Overall, Ober averaged 8.7 points and 8.2 rebounds while collecting six double-doubles.

Gebhardt in 13th at Iditarod

Paul Gebhardt, an area native currently living in Kasilof, Alaska, was in 13th place on Tuesday, March 15, the final day of the Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race, as the

Gebhardt moved to Alaska in 1989 and began “mushing” sled dogs in 1992.

Now 59-years-old, Gebhardt ran in his first Iditarod race in 1996 and has twice finished second – 2000 and 2007 – in the race from Anchorage to Nome, Alaska.

He placed 12th in last year’s Iditarod.

Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' basketball forward Maddy Kalenberg, pictured above with ball against St. Peter, earned an All-State Academic Team honor for compiling a grade-point av-

erage of 3.995. The Panthers as a whole claimed the "Silver Award" from the Minnesota State High School Coaches Association for a full-squad GPA of 3.525.

DNR trap shooting grants available

Minnesota shooting clubs will have another shot at developing or rehabilitating trap-shooting facilities as well as other ranges open to the public through a grants program from the Department of Natural Resources.

The 2014 Minnesota Legislature authorized more than \$2 million for matching grants to recreational shooting clubs for developing or rehabilitating trap shooting sports facilities for public use, with an emphasis on enhancing youth participation opportunities. The 2015 Legislature provided \$800,000 in additional funding for a wider variety of range development and rehabilitation.

"We still have trap range grant funding left that, along with added funding, will allow for the growth or improvement of skeet shooting

venues, as well as rifle and pistol ranges," said Chuck Niska, DNR shooting range program coordinator.

Ranges receiving funds must be open to the public on a reasonable basis, for a reasonable fee.

The first grant type consists of expedited small trap range grants of \$25,000 or less, or large trap range grants of \$25,000 or greater. There is \$650,000 available until funds are exhausted.

The second grant type includes small range grants of \$25,000 or less, or large range grants of \$25,000 or greater. There is \$800,000 available in 2016. These grants provide a wider variety of range development and rehabilitation.

Each grant recipient is required to equally match the amount of funds the DNR awards them.

Grant application packets are available online on the grants page at <http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/grants/recreation/rangedev.html>.

The application period will be March 15 to April 29. Grantees must have completed any prior DNR shooting range projects, with payments made and contracts closed. Grantees also must provide proof of local government approval, insurance and other information once grant awards are announced in May.

"Our hope is that these grants will allow facilities to add additional trap fields, upgrade equipment or make other improvements that enable more people to participate in the shooting sports," Niska said.

vacated 5th Street
Improvements include but are not limited to construction of sanitary sewer, water main, storm sewer, stormwater ponding, concrete curb and gutter, aggregate base, bituminous street surfacing, sidewalk, turf restoration, and miscellaneous items required to properly complete the improvements. Adoption by the council of the proposed assessment may occur at the hearing. The area proposed to be assessed for such improvements includes properties abutting such improvements, and non-abutting properties that benefit from the improvements.

Such assessment is proposed to be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January 2017, and will bear interest at a rate of 3.5 percent per annum after October 31, 2016. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from November 1, 2016, until December 31, 2017. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

You may at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the County Auditor-Treasurer on November 1, 2016, pay the entire assessment on such property to the office of the City Administrator. **No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by October 31, 2016.** You may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Administrator the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year. If you decide not to prepay the assessment before the date given above the rate of interest that will apply is 3.5 percent per year. The right to partially prepay the assessment is available.

The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the City Administrator's office. The total cost of the project is \$4,694,267.94. The total amount of the proposed assessment is \$981,493.98. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a written objection signed by the affected property owner is filed with the City Administrator prior to the assessment hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing. The council may upon such notice consider any objection to the amount of a proposed individual assessment at an adjourned meeting upon such further notice to the affected property owners as it deems advisable.

If an assessment is contested or there is an adjourned hearing, the following procedure will be followed:

1. The city will present its case first by calling witnesses who may testify by narrative or by

examination, and by the introduction of exhibits. After each witness has testified, the contesting party will be allowed to ask questions. This procedure will be repeated with each witness until neither side has further questions.

2. After the city has presented all its evidence, the objector may call witnesses or present such testimony as the objector desires. The same procedure for questioning of the city's witnesses will be followed with the objector's witnesses.
3. The objector may be represented by counsel.
4. Minnesota rules of evidence will not be strictly applied; however, they may be considered and argued to the council as to the weight of items of evidence or testimony presented to the council.
5. The entire proceedings will be tape-recorded (video-taped).
6. At the close of presentation of evidence, the objector may make a final presentation to the council based on the evidence and the law. No new evidence may be presented at this point.
7. The council may adopt the proposed assessment at the hearing.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 429.081 by serving notice of the appeal upon the mayor and city administrator of the city within 30 days after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the mayor or clerk.

Under Minn. Stat. §§ 435.193 to 435.195, the council may, in its discretion, defer the payment of this special assessment for any homestead property owned by a person 65 years of age or older for whom it would be a hardship to make the payments. When deferment of the special assessment has been granted and is terminated for any reason provided in that law, all amounts accumulated plus applicable interest become due. Any assessed property owner meeting the requirements of this law and the policy adopted under it may, within 30 days of the confirmation of the assessment, apply to the City Administrator for the prescribed form for such deferral of payment of this special assessment on their property.
