

Orth Foundation recipients of 2017

The 19th-annual Tim Orth Foundation basketball benefit in Glencoe is scheduled for the evening of Saturday, April 1, at the Glencoe-Silver Lake High School gymnasium.

The stated mission of the Tim Orth Memorial Foundation is to assist, financially or otherwise, children in the West Central Minnesota area who are facing substantial medical expenses in-

curred as a result of a serious accident or illness.

Tim Orth, for whom the organization is named, was a BOLD high school student/athlete who succumbed to an inoperable brain tumor on Feb. 14, 1997.

Two basketball games featuring area athletes will highlight an entertainment-packed night geared toward establishing a sense of love and care in the community. In addition to the basketball

games, there will be dancers, therapy dogs, gymnasts and much more.

Proceeds raised through admissions, concessions, donations, raffles and a silent auction will go toward 16 youths in the area.

Larson working hard to progress and develop

Good things come to those who wait – and work hard.

Beau Larson has to work harder than most 2-year olds to do things most of us take for granted. The Silver Lake resident, son of Eric and Christa Larson, contends with a developmental delay and low muscle tone, turning many childhood joys into arduous tasks.

“He was born with it,” Christa said. “There’s been no cause found. There’s been genetic testing and MRIs, but haven’t found a cause yet.”

It was first noticed when Beau was 4-5 months old. He just wasn’t doing the things babies were supposed to be doing – like rolling over on

his own. By the time he was six months old, he was undergoing physical therapy.

These days, Beau has six different therapists and a teacher assisting his development.

“At this point, the only thing there is to do is therapy,” Christa said. “He undergoes physical, occupational and speech therapy with Hutch Health and Glencoe-Silver Lake schools.”

The progress is slow, but momentous.

While Beau is not speaking, therapists are working on ways for him to communicate using a tablet as well as sign language. He’s doing well with crayons and is working with both shape sorters and puzzles.

Beau recently hit a milestone when he began walking more than crawling. He does so with the assistance of ankle braces and Christa estimates that he is now walking 75 percent of the time.

“It’s a huge thing for us,” she said. “We hope that with learning to walk, he will also learn kicking, jumping and running.”

Beau’s future is still unknown. While some challenges have been met, many more remain. But with the help of those around him, he keeps working hard to learn and grow.

“Nothing is for sure yet,” Christa said. “He’s still too young to know what the outlook will be.”

Dressel unable to partake in the joy of eating foods

Jase Dressel is a fun-loving, energetic child. The 3-year-old with a big smile and glasses has the look of a kid out of central casting.

A Silver Lake resident along with mother Jessica, father Zach and sister Ezra, Jase loves Thomas the Tank Engine and is a burgeoning Minnesota Wild fan.

However, whereas other children his age are discovering the delight of sweets and treats, as well as developing their own particular culinary likes and dislikes, Jase is unable to eat by mouth.

Jase has Eosinophilic Esophagitis (EoE), a chronic allergic/immune condition in which his body reacts adversely to protein in food. His esophagus – the tube in which food travels from the mouth to the stomach – becomes inflamed through the standard act of eating.

His food intake – a hypoallergenic dairy/soy mix – is done via tube. He can drink water, but other liquids are out of the question.

“Right now, there’s nothing that can be done to fix it, we use diet to control it,” Jase’s mother, Jessica, said. “It doesn’t affect him other

than his diet.”

Jase was diagnosed with EoE after a visit to Gillette Children’s Hospital in Minneapolis when he was just over a year old.

“He would be projectile vomiting after feedings,” Jessica said. “The doctors performed an upper endoscopy, which determined he had EoE.”

EoE affects approximately 1 in 10,000 people, according to the Cleveland Clinic. However, it is not thought to be a cancer cause, nor is the condition thought to affect life expectancy.

Autism robs Moses of ability to communicate

At first look, Brody Moses has the appearance of a typical young child. With a Twins cap on, the 4-year old looks ready to give it a go in the sandlot.

However, moderate-to-severe non-verbal autism has robbed him of many of the joys of a standard childhood.

Brody, a resident of New Auburn, is unable to speak and has difficulties processing the world around him.

“Bright lights and loud noises are really difficult for him,” Shana Prafke, Brody’s mother, said.

The signs of autism began to appear around Brody’s first birthday. A diagnosis at the Fraser clinic in 2014 con-

firmed that Brody did indeed have autism.

Since that time, Brody has undergone continual occupational and speech therapy sessions to help him function and communicate with those around him.

“He is unable to speak at all,” Shana said. “He works with a picture/exchange communication system and does very well with that. He hasn’t been interested in sign language yet.”

Brody attends an early learning program in Glencoe. Shana said that he can become frustrated at the inability to learn or perform a task.

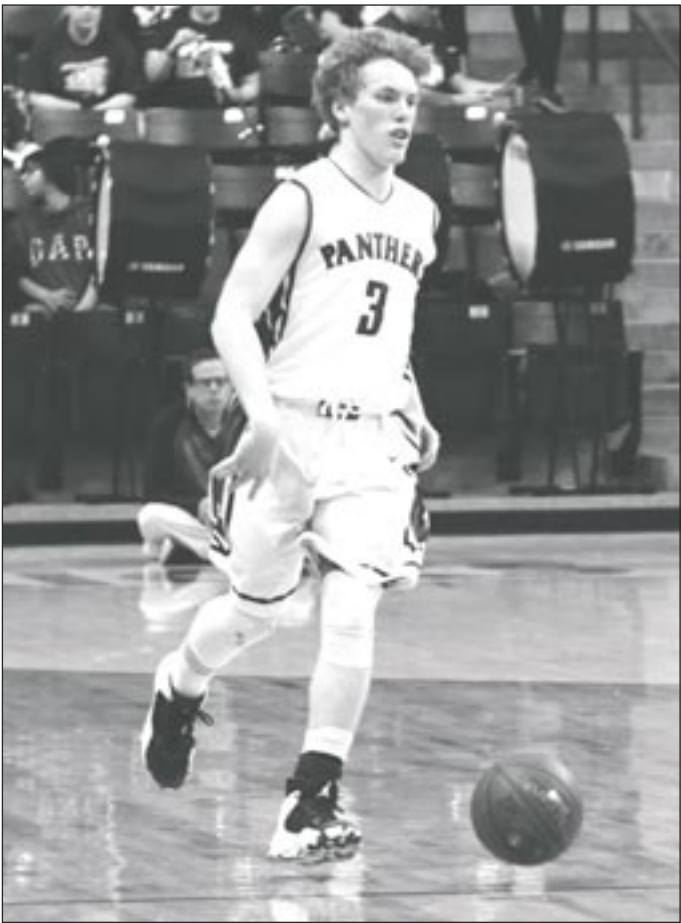
“He is a very independent boy,” Shana said. “He tries to do things himself instead of asking for help.”

There is hope that Brody will be able to go to Cosmos Learning Center this fall so that he can receive more direct support for his needs.

“We just enrolled papers for him,” Shana said. “I hope that he can start kindergarten there in the fall. There are not a lot of other schools in our area that offer that kind of support.”

In the meantime, Brody and Shana will continue to take part in events to help raise awareness and funds to assist those dealing with autism.

“We stay very active in the autism community,” Shana said. “I’m just happy that there is more awareness of autism now.”

Keep an eye on farm profitability

When I talk with local farmers, bankers and farm business management instructors, the first thing that gets brought up is how tight farm finances are. The current farming economy is creating difficult conversations. However, when it comes to farming businesses, these difficult conversations are the most important conversations to have. Now is the time to be proactive and not bury our heads in the sand.

Earlier this week, I had the opportunity to attend the 2017 Farm Management Profitability Conference in Lambertton. Throughout this conference, the one theme that stuck with me was that there are no silver bullets to change the way our farm balance sheets look. We need to focus on small changes that make a difference in our bottom line.

Throughout farm finances, there are a number of places to look to make these small changes, the first of which is the items that we are spending money on. Evaluate your traditional expenses. What items are working for you? Which items are not? When it comes to producing crops, knowing and understanding each and every one of your fields is vital. Perhaps a soil test would be helpful to give you a better idea of inputs that are needed. Take time to identify the fields that make the most sense to spend additional money versus other lower quality fields.

How about your income? One way to help manage your potential income is by having a proactive, not reactive, grain marketing plan. Edward Usset, grain market economist with the University of Minnesota, indicated that "Great marketing is not finding the high price. It's finding an extra 10-20 cents per bushel with a solid plan that avoids mistakes." A basic written marketing plan with prices and dates can be very helpful to get crops sold during the ideal time of the year. Understanding the historic runs in the markets is also beneficial to creating a successful marketing plan.

The final thing to keep in mind is that there are lots of information and resources available to help manage your farm finances. We are

fortunate in Minnesota to have access to the FINBIN database at www.finbin.umn.edu to view farm financial and production benchmark information. Also available to help is a number of outstanding bankers, farm business management instructors, and Extension educators. Don't be afraid to ask for help!

University of Minnesota Extension has announced it will begin offering one-to-one financial counseling to farmers in serious financial stress.

"We know that due to a variety of factors, including ongoing low prices, some farmers find themselves facing difficult circumstances," said Bev Durgan, Extension dean. "With our new program, Extension offers distressed farmers help in understanding their financial situation and exploring options to keep their farms functioning as a viable enterprise."

To set up a confidential appointment with an Extension farm financial analyst, farmers can call the Farm Information Line at 1-800- 232-9077.

The Extension program is expected to run for two years and will be modeled after similar services offered in Kansas and Iowa. It will augment services currently available in Minnesota, including the Farmer-Lender Mediation program, which is overseen by Extension, and the state

Department of Agriculture's Minnesota Farm Advocates assistance.

Financial analysts include retired agricultural business professionals from Extension and other organizations. The program is set up to provide analysts at geographically diverse locations in Minnesota. They've undergone training to update their capabilities and will work closely with current Extension colleagues.

"Compared to the 1980s, the magnitude of the financial stress on Minnesota farms is not as widespread. That's good news, but it may also keep the many farmers in difficult circumstances from seeking the kind of help that they need," said Extension agricultural economist Kevin Klair, who leads Extension's Agricultural Business Management program. "That's why we're working with a variety of agriculture interests in Minnesota, including the banking industry, to reach out and let farmers know we can help them explore their options."
