

GSL girls, boys track and field sweep in Mankato

It was a joyful start to the spring season for the Glencoe-Silver Lake track and field teams as both the Panther boys and girls won their respective competitions at the WEM Indoor Invite at Minnesota State University in Mankato on Tuesday, April

The GSL girls eked out a nailbiter, topping Lake Crystal

Wellcome Memorial by just 4.95 seconds. three points 108.5-105.5 for first place. The Panther boys had a slightly more comfortable victory, taking first place by 17 points with an even 100 points on the night.

GSL won five of 14 events in the girls' competition. Maddie Monahan took first in the 200-meter dash with a time of 28.90 seconds, with Emily Graupmann winning the 400meter dash in one minute,

Malavh Metcalf won the 1600-meter run in 5:44.11, with Mickalyn Frahm winning the 55-meter hurdles in 9.80. In the field, Zoe Christensen returned to competition with a first-place finish in the shot put after a toss of 34 feet, 10.25 inches.

Christensen also finished second in the 55 hurdles with a run of 9.91. Erin Jaskowiak took second in the 55-meter

dash in 8.15, with Olivia Lemke placing second in the pole vault with a fling of eight feet even. Kaitlyn Popp also took second in shot put with a throw of 26-10.25.

GSL won two of three relays on the night, taking first in the 4x200- and 4x400meter events with respective times of 1:57.18 and 4:32.72.

In the boys' competition, the Panthers earned first-place finishes in six of 17 events.

Kyle Christensen won the (3:58.54) 55 in 7.05, with Cody Rae taking first in the 800-meter run in 2:22.70 and Austin Schroepfer winning the 1600 in 4:40.63

In the field, Tyler Ehrke won the long jump with a leap of 17-11.5, while Jacob Litzau won the shot put with a lob of

GSL also won the 4x200 in a time of 1:41.40, while taking second in both the 4x400

(9:33.87).

Connor Kantack placed second in shot put after posting a 42-8.25, with Gage Alsleben taking second in the 200 with a 26.36.

GSL competed at New London-Spicer on Tuesday, after the Chronicle went to press, and heads north for another invitational meet at Foley High School on Friday afternoon.

Panthers go on a tear

The Glencoe-Silver Lake baseball team claimed the first three wins of its young season over the past week, defeating Litchfield and Maple Lake.

With the wins, the Panthers sprung back above the .500 mark after dropping their season opener to Hutchinson.

The first triumph of GSL's spring came in a 5-3 win at Watertown-Mayer on Tuesday, April 11, with Luke Frahm earning the victory in relief of starting pitcher Mitchell Boesche.

The Panthers rallied from their second win in a row. Sell

deficits of 1-0 and 3-2 for the started and went seven inwin, the final fightback coming via a three-run sixth inning that decided matters for good.

Five different GSL players - Boesche, Alex Troska, Spencer Lepel, Gabe Roepke and Taylor Schauer - claimed one RBI each, with Carsen Streich, Troska, Lepel, Schauer and Korey Johnson scoring one run each. Streich, Boesche and Peyton Sell had two hits each.

A 3-2 extra-innings victory at Litchfield on Thursday, April 13, gave the Panthers nings, allowing two runs one earned – on six hits and one walk while striking out three batters to earn the win. Frahm tossed a scoreless eighth with two punchouts for

the save. Sell and Frahm were put in position for their respective win and save after Johnson scored the go-ahead run from second base on a throwing error off a ball hit by Lepel in the top of the eighth.

GSL had earlier taken a 2-0 lead in the top of the first with Troska and Johnson driving in Streich and Boesche, respectively.

However, the Dragons rallied with single tallies in both the second and third innings to knot the score at 2-2 where it remained until the Panthers broke through in the eighth and final frame.

Streich, Sell, Johnson and Boesche each had a pair of hits in the contest, with Troska and Schauer netting one hit apiece.

After ending last week with a win, GSL began this week with another.

The Panthers also gained a small measure of revenge on Maple Lake – the team that ended GSL's season in last year's sectional playoffs - by means of a 4-1 win at Vollmer Field on Monday, April 17.



American Red Cross (ARC) Lifeguard Training includes certification in Lifeguard Training and First Aid valid for 2 years and CPR/AED for the Profession Rescuer, also valid for two years.

THE FOLLOWING ARE THE COURSE PREREQUISITES:

 Minimum age of 15
 Swim continuously by demonstrating breath control and rhythmic breathing. Candidates may swim using the front crawl, breaststroke of a combination of both, but swimming on the back or side is not allowed. Swim goggles may be used. Swim is not timed. Tread Water for two minutes using only the legs. Candidates

should place their hands under the armpits. Complete a timed event within 1 minute 40 seconds.

Starting in the water, swim 20 yards, the face may be in or out of the water. Swim goggles are not allowed.

Surface dive, feet-first or head-first to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10 pound object.

> Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point with both hands holding the object and keeping the face at or near the surface so they are able to get a breath. Candidates should not swim the distance under water.

 Exit the water without using a ladder or steps. NOTE: THOSE NOT PASSING THE PREREQUISITES WILL NOT CONTINUE IN THE COURSE
