

## GSL girls, boys track and field sweep in Mankato

It was a joyful start to the spring season for the Glencoe-Silver Lake track and field teams as both the Panther boys and girls won their respective competitions at the WEM Indoor Invite at Minnesota State University in Mankato on Tuesday, April 11.

The GSL girls eked out a nailbiter, topping Lake Crystal

Wellcome Memorial by just three points 108.5-105.5 for first place. The Panther boys had a slightly more comfortable victory, taking first place by 17 points with an even 100 points on the night.

GSL won five of 14 events in the girls' competition. Maddie Monahan took first in the 200-meter dash with a time of 28.90 seconds, with Emily Graupmann winning the 400-meter dash in one minute,

4.95 seconds.

Malayh Metcalf won the 1600-meter run in 5:44.11, with Mickalyn Frahm winning the 55-meter hurdles in 9.80. In the field, Zoe Christensen returned to competition with a first-place finish in the shot put after a toss of 34 feet, 10.25 inches.

Christensen also finished second in the 55 hurdles with a run of 9.91. Erin Jaskowiak took second in the 55-meter

dash in 8.15, with Olivia Lemke placing second in the pole vault with a fling of eight feet even. Kaitlyn Popp also took second in shot put with a throw of 26-10.25.

GSL won two of three relays on the night, taking first in the 4x200- and 4x400-meter events with respective times of 1:57.18 and 4:32.72.

In the boys' competition, the Panthers earned first-place finishes in six of 17 events.

Kyle Christensen won the 55 in 7.05, with Cody Rae taking first in the 800-meter run in 2:22.70 and Austin Schroepfer winning the 1600 in 4:40.63.

In the field, Tyler Ehrke won the long jump with a leap of 17-11.5, while Jacob Litzau won the shot put with a lob of 46-06.

GSL also won the 4x200 in a time of 1:41.40, while taking second in both the 4x400

(3:58.54) and 4x800 (9:33.87).

Connor Kantack placed second in shot put after posting a 42-8.25, with Gage Alsleben taking second in the 200 with a 26.36.

GSL competed at New London-Spicer on Tuesday, after the Chronicle went to press, and heads north for another invitational meet at Foley High School on Friday afternoon.

## Panthers go on a tear

The Glencoe-Silver Lake baseball team claimed the first three wins of its young season over the past week, defeating Litchfield and Maple Lake.

With the wins, the Panthers sprung back above the .500 mark after dropping their season opener to Hutchinson.

The first triumph of GSL's spring came in a 5-3 win at Watertown-Mayer on Tuesday, April 11, with Luke Frahm earning the victory in relief of starting pitcher Mitchell Boesche.

The Panthers rallied from

deficits of 1-0 and 3-2 for the win, the final fightback coming via a three-run sixth inning that decided matters for good.

Five different GSL players – Boesche, Alex Troska, Spencer Lepel, Gabe Roepke and Taylor Schauer – claimed one RBI each, with Carsen Streich, Troska, Lepel, Schauer and Corey Johnson scoring one run each. Streich, Boesche and Peyton Sell had two hits each.

A 3-2 extra-innings victory at Litchfield on Thursday, April 13, gave the Panthers their second win in a row. Sell

started and went seven innings, allowing two runs – one earned – on six hits and one walk while striking out three batters to earn the win. Frahm tossed a scoreless eighth with two punchouts for the save.

Sell and Frahm were put in position for their respective win and save after Johnson scored the go-ahead run from second base on a throwing error off a ball hit by Lepel in the top of the eighth.

GSL had earlier taken a 2-0 lead in the top of the first with Troska and Johnson driving in Streich and Boesche, respec-

tively.

However, the Dragons rallied with single tallies in both the second and third innings to knot the score at 2-2 – where it remained until the Panthers broke through in the eighth and final frame.

Streich, Sell, Johnson and Boesche each had a pair of hits in the contest, with Troska and Schauer netting one hit apiece.

After ending last week with a win, GSL began this week with another.

The Panthers also gained a small measure of revenge on Maple Lake – the team that ended GSL's season in last year's sectional playoffs – by means of a 4-1 win at Vollmer Field on Monday, April 17.

Johnson allowed the Irish a lone run in the top of the first inning, and nothing more after that. He went all seven innings for a complete-game four-hitter, striking out two and walking one.

The Panther starter was on base and scored as Schauer lashed a two-out, bases-loaded double that plated three runs to all-but decide the contest in the bottom of the fourth inning.

Schauer himself came home on a proceeding single by Frahm to finalize the scoring on the evening.

GSL netted just five hits in gaining its four runs, but benefitted heavily from five walks in the victory.

Mound Westonka paid Vollmer Field a visit on Tuesday, April 18, after the Chronicle went to press. The Panthers are also scheduled to host Dassel-Cokato on Thursday and Annandale on Friday.

## Softball takes two victories

After nearly winning its season opener before falling in extra innings, the Glencoe-Silver Lake softball team did claim a pair of one-run wins to open this week with a 2-1 overall record.

The Panthers rallied from a 2-0 second-inning deficit against visiting Watertown-Mayer in the season opener on Tuesday, April 11, taking a 4-2 lead in the middle frames.

However, the Royals rallied and sent the game into an added stanza, where they clinched the win over their hosts.

Molli Cacka knocked in two runs for GSL, with Lexi Hansch, Morgan Mathews and Brianna Wraspir each logging one RBI apiece in the loss. Mathews, Sam Voigt, Kasidy Cacka, Kaitlyn Uecker and Kylie Ness each scored one run each.

GSL rebounded well from the defeat, winning 5-4 against Litchfield on Thursday, April 13, and 2-1

against Sibley East on Monday, April 17.

The Panthers and Dragons were tied 2-2 after one inning and 4-4 after the fourth before Molli Cacka drove in Hansch the winning run on an infield grounder in the fifth inning.

Wraspir, who earned her first pitching win of the season, helped her own cause with three RBI in the contest.

GSL followed that up with a nail-biting one-run win against visiting Sibley East, hanging on for victory after scoring both of its runs in the bottom of the second inning on a hit by Ness.

Wraspir struck out six batters in earning her second pitching win of the year.

The Panthers traveled to Mound Westonka on Tuesday, after the Chronicle went to press, and remain on the road at Dassel-Cokato on Thursday.

GSL is scheduled to return home to face Holy Family Catholic on Monday.

#### JV Softball

The Glencoe-Silver Lake junior varsity softball team began the week with a spotless 3-0 record that included a pair of blowout victories.

After opening the season with a 15-2 besting of Watertown-Mayer on Tuesday, April 11, the Panthers eased past Litchfield 7-5 two days later and then blasted Sibley East 12-1 on Monday, April 17.

Taylor Kaczmarek drove in six runs via a home run, a single and an RBI groundout against the Royals. She also earned the win on the mound after allowing just two runs, one hit and no walks while striking out four batters over five innings.

GSL had to hold on against a Litchfield rally after taking a 6-0 lead. The Dragons scored five runs over the final two frames, but could not pull even as the Panthers emerged with the two-run win. Sydney Lepel and Kaczmarek had two RBI apiece. Kaczmarek earned her second win of the season in the contest.

There was no such drama in Monday's contest, as a nine-run outburst over the fourth and fifth innings brought an early end to an 11-run victory. Kaylee Lemke and Kaczmarek had three RBI apiece, with Lepel scoring four times and Hannah Boesche crossing the plate three times. Tess Chap earned the win with seven strikeouts and just one hit and one unearned run allowed over five innings.

## DNR equipment auction on April 29

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources will hold an auction of confiscated hunting and fishing equipment on Saturday, April 29, beginning at 9 a.m. The auction items are from people who forfeited their equipment after committing serious game violations.

The last auction was in 2014 and there is a large inventory available.

The public auction will be at Hiller Auction Service, 10785 261st Ave., Zimmerman.

Items offered for sale include, but are not limited to: firearms, bows, tree stands, fishing rods and reels, tip-ups, traps, trail camera, spotlights, scopes and spears. There are 387 firearms, 100 bows, 280 other items.

Inspection of items will be available on Friday, April 28, from 1 to 4 p.m., and at 7 a.m. the day of the auction. Once the auction begins, there will be no ac-

cess to firearms.

All equipment is sold as is, including all defects or faults, known or unknown. Items cannot be returned once they have been purchased. Buyers may bring their own cases and there will be cases available for purchase to transport firearms.

Anyone purchasing a firearm will be required to pass a background check.

Revenue from the auction goes to the Game and Fish Fund, the DNR's most important fund for delivering fish, wildlife and law enforcement programs. It is used, among other things, to manage 5,400 fishing lakes, 1,400 Wildlife Management Areas and support 150-plus field conservation officers.

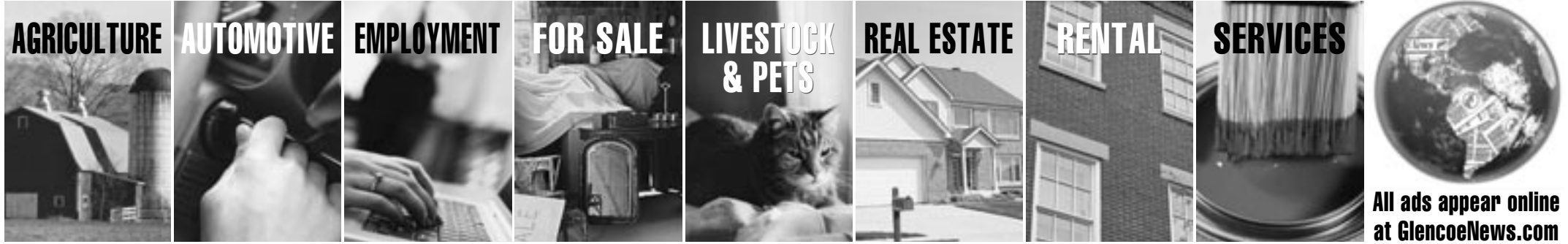

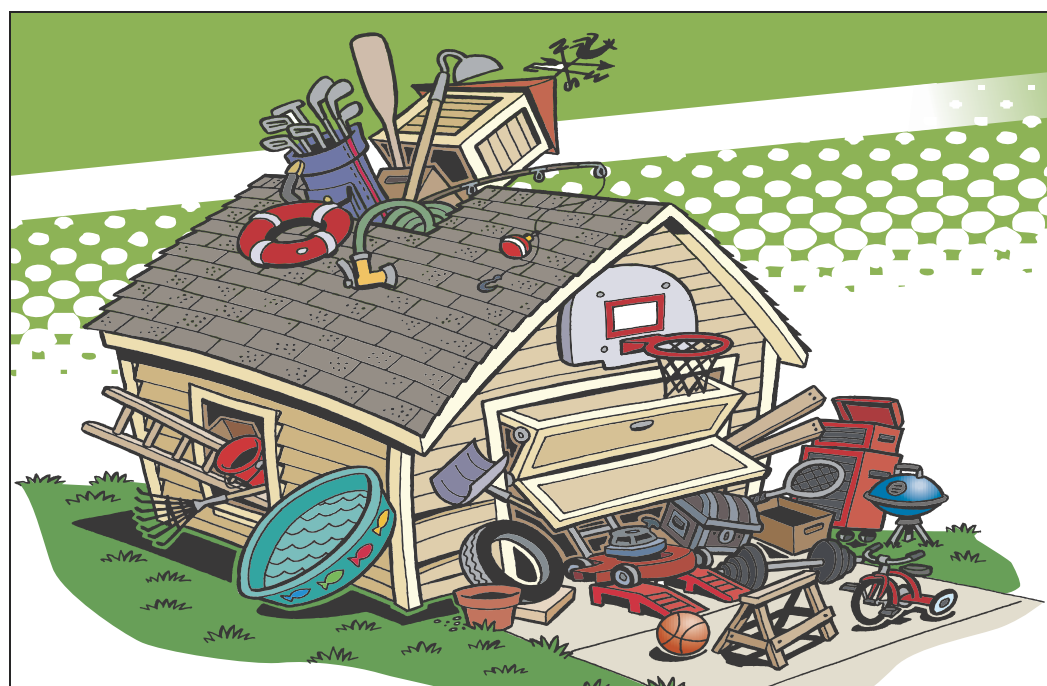

Have you ever wanted to become a lifeguard? If you have, the City of Glencoe is in need of additional lifeguards at the Glencoe Aquatics Center. The City of Glencoe will hire and share in the cost of training the first 8 qualified applicants for summer lifeguarding positions at the Glencoe Aquatics Center.

If you are interested and meet the minimum course qualifications, please pick up an application at the Glencoe City Center, 1107 11th Street East, Glencoe. An interview will be scheduled.

It is anticipated that the class will be held May 25, 26, 27 & 28th, and will consist of 26 hours of Class time. This class will teach the knowledge and skills needed to prevent and respond to aquatic emergencies. American Red Cross (ARC) Lifeguard Training includes certification in Lifeguard Training and First Aid valid for 2 years and CPR/AED for the Profession Rescuer, also valid for two years.

**THE FOLLOWING ARE THE COURSE PREREQUISITES:**

- Minimum age of 15
- Swim continuously by demonstrating breath control and rhythmic breathing. Candidates may swim using the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both, but swimming on the back or side is not allowed. Swim goggles may be used. Swim is not timed.
- Tread Water for two minutes using only the legs. Candidates should place their hands under the armpits.
- Complete a timed event within 1 minute 40 seconds.
- Starting in the water, swim 20 yards, the face may be in or out of the water. Swim goggles are not allowed.
- Surface dive, feet-first or head-first to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10 pound object.
- Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point with both hands holding the object and keeping the face at or near the surface so they are able to get a breath. Candidates should not swim the distance under water.
- Exit the water without using a ladder or steps.
