

Doubleheaders in bloom for Panther baseball

It's been doubleheaders galore for the Glencoe-Silver Lake baseball team. The Panthers are making up for lost time with six of their seven games last week being contested under a "Let's play two!" format.

After going 3-0 to start the season, GSL suffered its first loss in the opening game of a Wright County Conference West doubleheader against Litchfield on Tuesday, May 1, at Vollmer Field.

The Dragons put up three runs in the second inning and never trailed in a 4-2 victory. Carsen Streich accounted for all of the Panthers' offense by means of a two-run home run to left field in the fifth inning.

GSL starter Korey Johnson took the complete-game loss after allowing eight hits and four runs while walking one and striking out five.

The Panthers had their revenge in the nightcap, rallying from a quick three-run deficit with a pair of runs in the second inning and three more in the fourth to claim a 5-3 victory.

Chandler Glaeser scattered 10 hits and one walk while striking out three batters over six innings in a complete game victory. He helped his own cause with a two-run sin-

gle in the fourth that put GSL up for good.

The Panthers earned another doubleheader split two days later at Annandale, winning 4-3 and losing 5-2.

The split was secured as GSL rallied for four runs in their final at-bat to turn a shutout loss into a one-run triumph.

After Tyler Siewert got the Panthers on the board with a two-out RBI single, Streich drove home Spencer Lepel and Siewert with a two-run double with Taylor Schauer coming home on an error by the left fielder for the win.

Starting pitcher Joe Knudten earned the completegame win after allowing six hits and two earned runs while striking out one.

GSL opened its weekend by battering a trio of non-conference opponents.

After eking by Norwood Young America, 10-9, on April 28, the Panthers roared past the Raiders in the rematch, winning 14-2 on Friday, May 4.

Streich and Glaeser each knocked in three RBI, while starter Brett Baumgarten earned the win.

GSL brought the big bats to Lester Prairie the next day, walloping the host Bulldogs by a combined score of 27-4 to improve to 8-2 this spring.







Who will equip God's people?

∠ The gifts Christ gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints of the work of ministry..." Eph. 4:11-12a

Who will be the pastors leading all our churches in 10 years? In my denomination, we are seeing less people attend seminary and more pastors reaching retirement age. This comes at the same time when the church body itself is aging and declining in numbers. We wonder what the future be for God's Church in our country. We trust that God's Church will continue in some form because God has an ongoing mission and assembles the Church for that mission. God will also have pastors to equip the Church for mission as it says in Ephesians. But will there be enough pastors? This is a concern.

Just how does God call people to be pastors? It is common to speak of God's call in two ways – an interior call and an exterior call. The interior call happens when something in a person believes that this is the ministry God wants them to do. The exterior call happens when other people affirm that calling and approve the person for the ordained ministry.

I say all this to get to two questions. First, is God calling you to be a pastor in the church? There are many who hear this call at as a young adult, but there are others who hear this interior call to be a pastor later in life. If you have thought about this vocation in the past, maybe it is time to consider it again. God may need you to equip God's church in future years.

Second question, is God wanting you to help a person hear the call to be a pastor? You may be one of the people through which God works to give the exterior call to another. You may say something like, "I think you would be a good pastor." or 'You have gifts to be a pastor, have you considered it?" Your affirmation of them may open the door for a person to consider it.






