

Blue Jay winning streak hits lucky number seven

A monstrous summer run continued for the Plato Blue Jays last week as the Crow River Valley League leaders scored a victory at one of their most heated rivals before recording win No. 10 of the season at home.

Plato pecked away at the host Irish on Thursday, June 28, taking a 4-1 lead after the fifth inning. The Blue Jays finished off their hosts with a run in the seventh and three more in the eighth to finish off the seven-run triumph.

Tyler Lang led the offense with a home run, two RBI and two runs scored as part of a 2-for-4 day at the plate. Matt Odegaard went 3-for-4 and two runs scored.

Starting pitcher Adam Prehn scattered seven hits and one earned run over eight innings, striking out four batters with just one walk. Offensively, Prehn also had two RBI. Dylan McCormick pitched the ninth, setting down the

side in order with one strike-out.

Back at Bluejay Stadium on Saturday, June 30, Plato busted open a game that was close early and claimed a 12-2 win over visiting Brownnton.

The game was tied 2-all heading into the bottom of the third inning before Chris Odegaard launched a home run to give the hosts a 3-2 edge they did not relinquish.

Plato increased the lead to 6-2 in the fourth with three runs after two outs were recorded. Odegaard began the rally after being hit by a pitch, stealing second and coming home on a Prehn single to make the score 4-2.

Kyle Panning kept the hit parade going with a single, followed by a broken bat single by Joe Nix that scored Prehn to make the count 5-2. McCormick finished off the streak with one last RBI single that scored Panning to

Post 641 splits with Holy Family

The Plato American Legion Post 641 baseball team headed into the July 4 holiday break by winning one of its last three games in the month of June.

Plato opened last week with a 5-2 loss at Hutchinson on Monday, June 25. Hutch took a 5-0 lead in the second inning, with Post 641 countering with its two runs of the contest in the fifth.

Ty Christensen drove in both of Plato's runs on a bases-loaded single, plating Andrew Wraspir and Jared Loksensgard. Christensen's hit was one of just three base knocks for Post 641 on the day, with Spencer Lillienthal logging the other two hits as part of a 2-for-3 game out of the leadoff spot.

Starting pitcher Taylor Schauer took the loss, despite just two of the five runs allowed being earned. He

struck out one while scattering five hits over three innings. Dane Schwartz and Chandler Glaeser also pitched for Plato in the game.

The summer winds blew hot across the field at Bluejay Stadium as Post 641 hosted Holy Family for a doubleheader on Friday, June 29.

Plato took the first of two five-inning contests on the steamy evening, winning 2-1 behind starting pitcher Korey Johnson's three-hitter. John-

son gave up one earned run while walking one and striking out four batters in the narrow win.

Post 641 notched the win despite recording just one hit in the game, a two-out single by Schauer in the third inning.

Holy Family took the initial lead with its lone run of the game in the top of the

Post 5102 closes out June above .500 mark

The Glencoe VFW Post 5102 baseball team closed out the month of June by winning three of four games, splitting a doubleheader with the Hutchinson 16s Junior Legion squad before sweeping Annandale.

Blake Mickolichuk and Drew Hedtke teamed up for a two-hit shutout as Glencoe won the opener against Hutch on Monday, June 25.

Mickolichuk started and struck out seven while allowing one hit over 4-1/3 innings before Hedtke came on to close out the contest and earn the save.

Hedtke also scored the lone run of the game after reaching on an error in the third before eventually scoring on a RBI by Jake Christianson.

Game Two was another matter, as Hutch logged 12 hits en route to a 10-3 win. Post 5102 had three hits, with Isaiah Streich rapping a double, while Reece Schwartz and Bennett Lepel both recorded singles. Schwartz, Max Edwards and Zach Voelz each scored one run apiece for Glencoe.

Three days later, Post 5102 claimed a doubleheader

sweep against Annandale, winning 4-3 and 11-0.

Voelz claimed the game-winning RBI in extra innings of Game One, walking with the bases loaded in the sixth to score Mickolichuk with the victorious tally.


Mickolichuk, who went 2-for-3 at the plate, scored twice in the game. Hedtke earned the win with three scoreless innings in relief of starter Christianson.

Game Two was not nearly as dramatic as Glencoe blanked Annandale 11-0 on a season-high 16 hits.

Hedtke started and earned yet another win after scattering six hits over four innings with five strikeouts. Preston Sturges mopped up by tossing a scoreless fifth to close out the contest.

Christianson went 3-for-3 with three RBI, while Lepel went 2-for-4 with two RBI. Streich and Voelz both went 2-for-4 with one RBI, while Schwartz went 3-for-4 and Sturges went 2-for-4.

The 3-1 week boosted Post 5102's record to 9-8 on the season heading into the July 4 holiday break. Glencoe returns to action on Monday, July 9, with a 6:30 p.m. game at Sleepy Eye.

Brewers on a four-game skid

An 8-4 home defeat to Watertown on Sunday, July 1, sent the Glencoe Brewers into the July 4 holiday break on a four-game losing streak.

It was the second setback of the week for the Brewers, as the squad also suffered an 11-5 defeat versus visiting St. Boni on Wednesday, June 27.

The Saints completed the regular-season sweep over the Brewers by breaking open a close 2-1 contest with nine runs over the final three innings.

Glencoe put up four runs in the eighth, a frame that included RBI walks from Brody Bratsch, Alex Romano and Andrew Wraspir. However, it was not enough as the hosts went down with three strikeouts in the bottom of the ninth of the six-run loss.

The Brewers collected just four hits, but also netted nine walks in the contest. Gannon Jordahl recorded Glencoe's lone extra-base hit, notching

his team's first RBI of the game by driving in Bratsch on a double in the sixth.

Derek Bratsch started on the mound and took the loss after 6-2/3 innings pitched; four of the seven runs scored against him were earned. Tanner Grack pitched the final 2-2/3 innings.

The Brewers finished up their pre-July 4 schedule with the home loss to the Red Devils.

Glencoe took the opening lead as Grack drove home Brody Bratsch on an RBI single in the bottom of the first inning.

Watertown scored twice in the top of the third, before Grack knotted the score at 2-2 with another RBI single in the bottom of the frame – this time driving in Colt Trebesch.

The Red Devils put the game out of reach with five runs total over the fifth and sixth innings before posting one final tally in the ninth.

The Brewers put several runners in the later innings,

but managed to score just two more runs with Colt Trebesch coming home in the fifth and Wraspir driving home Cameron Chap in the seventh.

Starting pitcher Jaime Pautmen picked up the loss after allowing seven runs – just three earned – while striking out six batters over 5-2/3 innings. Trebesch threw the final 3-1/3 innings for the hosts.

With the loss, Glencoe finished the week at 5-10 overall, 4-9 in Crow River Valley League play.

Coming out of the holiday, Glencoe has a festive weekend planned. First up, the Brewers are scheduled to host Richmond at 4 p.m. Saturday afternoon in a matchup commemorating the 20th anniversary of when the two teams met for the state title.

The next day, Glencoe is slated to travel to face Waconia in a 5 p.m. start. The Lakers won the first meeting between the teams, 13-8, on June 17.




