

Tall aspirations: boys want top 3 in state

After taking eighth as a team at last year's state cross country meet at St. Olaf College, the Glencoe-Silver Lake boys' cross country team expects a lot from a 2014 squad that returns all but two members from a season ago.

Head Coach Jeff Delwiche stated his group's objectives confidently and said, "Our goal is to win the conference, to win the section, and be at least top three (at state)," after losing only Cody Becker and Casey Schulz to graduation.

Currently, milesplit.com has GSL ranked fourth in Class A behind Waseca at No. 3, Perham at No. 2, and top-ranked Martin County West. Perham was the only one of those four teams to finish inside the top three at last year's state meet, taking first.

Delwiche feels the aspirations of his squad are warranted, and could easily come to fruition if one thing happens: "(We need to) Stay healthy," he said.

"Their teamwork right now is right on track. Their training is right on track, and they don't seem to be appearing to race themselves every practice," said Delwiche. "I think all they've got to do right now is stay

mates that pitted them against runners. The latter seems to be each other instead of opposing taken care of, but only time will

tell of the former. "We were arguing in the beginning last year and we're going to try not doing that this year," said Jac Chelman with a bit of a laugh, who's currently ranked 12th as an individual. "We're going to go all out, that's all I know. We want top three (at state)."

"I think the biggest thing they learned (from last season) is that they've all just got to get along, and it makes the running a whole lot easier," said Delwiche. "I see them as a team and I see them working together and having fun."

Chelman headlines the list of returnees, along with fellow seniors Brandon Richter, Isiah Herout, Garrett Ober and Garret Ardolf. Eric Kruschke, also a senior, will look to fill in where needed on varsity, along with sophomore Austin Schroepfer, who filled in for Schulz at the state meet.

GSL will compete in the West Division of the Wright County Conference, and resides in Section 5 where its greatest competition should be Mora, which is currently ranked seventh in state. But Delwiche feels a healthy core of Panthers

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Blue Jays get a 'sour taste' at state

Another disappointing finish to an outstanding season of baseball climaxed close to home during the Class C state tournament Sunday in Arlington, as the Plato Blue Jays fell to the Kimball Express 7-6 on a walk-off single by Ben Johnson.

"It's a carbon copy of what we did last year," Blue Jay Manager Adam Dammann said disappointedly in comparing Plato's loss to New Prague in its first game of last year's state tournament. "We wanted to get over that hump, but we just couldn't do it again."

The opening round game wasn't scheduled so far north, but the home of the As became the third site for Sunday's suspenseful showdown after the Mini Met in Jordan, Minn. resembled the River Jordan when it started pouring in the eighth and ninth.

After a lengthy rain delay, the game was scheduled to resume at Belle Plaine an hour later at 7:15 p.m., before the convoy of fans and players continued on to Arlington after another delay prompted the call from the Minnesota Baseball Association.

Plato was in the midst of mounting a ninth-inning, three-run, one-out comeback

before the Mini Met drowned a downpour that tried to curb Kyle Panning and the revived Blue Jay offense.

Panning had to wait over two hours and travel approximately 40 miles to two different ball parks, knowing it was his job to somehow keep the offensive inertia unfettered after Brian Graupmann hit an RBI single that left Plato down 6-4. Despite the stall, the lefty drew his team-high 15th walk to load the bases for Nick Johnson, who skipped a single past the infield for a pair of game-tying

Heavy on the seniors this season, boasting nine compared with only four a season ago, Robb DeCorsey likes the chances of his Panther tennis team possibly grabbing a spot just outside the top three teams in the Wright County Conference.

Overall, the 2013 Panthers went 7-15 and finished fifth in the conference. But missing from the cast this year is Kelly Arnold, who finished fourth as an individual at sections, and earned honorable mention honors.

Though Arnold and three other seniors departed, nine new girls begin the task of filling their shoes and guiding the underclassman through the program.

Admittedly, DeCorsey said Orono, Delano, Mound Westonka and Holy Family Catholic are most likely the top four favorites in the conference. Of those four, Glencoe-Silver Lake beat only Mound Westonka 4-3 a season ago.

"It's going to kind of depend on where we can fit in," DeCorsey said. "There are four teams that are probably better than us, but maybe we can put together a match and pull some

things out."

Set to take over as the No. 1 individual player is senior Piper Davis, who's ecstatic to hold down the team's top spot, but said the their goals don't stop within the conference.

"I'm just really excited that I've worked hard enough to earn it (the No. 1 spot)," Davis said. She added that this group of senior girls "is going to make us a strong force to be reckoned with. Hopefully we can get to state and sections as a team. That's one of our goals."

Davis will have to play a pivotal role while facing every team's best player week in and week out, but so far, DeCorsey said she's scary.

"Piper crushes the tennis ball," said DeCorsey. "She scares people, which is good. I like that."

But knowing his team's lofty aspirations toward state, DeCorsey said "If you want to reach that goal, every ball counts. Every day, every ball counts."

For the past two seasons, GSL has lost 7-0 to Providence Academy in the Section 5 (Class A) tournament.

Rusty Chains Classic goes modern

This year's third annual Rusty Chains Classic Disc Golf Tournament will have a new look when the event begins Sunday at Oak Leaf Park.

With the installment of the new nine-hole disc golf course this summer, it will be the first year the tournament isn't held on the old course and baskets.

Five divisions are offered for players, ranging from women's, recreational, intermediate, advanced, and open.

Sign up starts at 8:45 a.m. and concludes at 9:30 a.m., with a players' meeting following 15 minutes after sign up ends. Discs are set to fly at 10 a.m., with competitors playing 40 holes total.

Panther girls need more goals

It won't be an easy task improving a team that went 1-14 last year, especially after losing the two best all around players on the team to graduation, but Zach Otto-Fisher knows what's in front of him as head coach of the Panther girls' soccer team.

"Now we need to score goals," said Otto-Fisher with an honest laugh, "Last year we lacked there a little bit."

The laugh stems from the fact that the head coach knows his team was outscored 82-7 over the 15-game schedule it weathered.

That stat makes one wonder where any optimism could possibly come from. But despite that massive difference, consider this: as an eighth grader, goalie Zoe Christensen stopped 372 of the 454 shots taken on her.

Christensen made herself big and wide in between the posts last year for Glencoe-Silver Lake. Looking even a tad bit taller from the previous season, she'll have to be the Tim Howard to Otto-Fisher's Team USA since changing their defensive formation.

"We don't have four solid defenders," Otto-Fisher divulged, "so we're just going to go with three and see how it goes. When you've got Zoe in goal, she's a defender-and-a-half back there."

As far as expectations go, the head coach was modest.

"I think we can go and get four or five of the games this year," Otto-Fisher said after admitting his team is still very young and building. There are three seniors, and only one that saw substantial time last year, Keisha Prafke, who

Otto-Fisher said will have to "attack the goal more this year."

While he has nine juniors on this year's team, most of the girls returning with experience are underclassmen, including eighth-grader Emily

Thalmann.

The season starts Saturday in Rocori at 11 a.m., while the Wright County Conference schedule begins on Thursday, Sept. 4, at home against Waconia. The Panthers still reside in Section 2 (Class A).

Savre expects 6 seniors to lead

What the Glencoe-Silver Lake girls' cross country team lost in six-time varsity letter winner and multiple state entrant Tori Burr after she graduated this past spring, it will try and make up for with six seniors and a host of returning letter winners.

"We hope we have a lot of Tori Burrs in the future, but it's going to take some time to get there," Head Coach Jann Savre said. "It's going to take some time to patiently develop runners for us, and that's kind of what we're doing this year."

Savre admitted to fielding a group of "inexperienced runners," but said it's about how the team progresses and competes until the final day of the season.

"We're not going to have much varsity experience, but we're not going to look at the first day of practice, we're going to look at the last day that we run," said Savre. "We want to just keep getting stronger each day."

The Panthers haven't hashed out any goals yet, though Savre did say "we want to do better than last year, because we can. We have the program in place and

there's no reason why we can't."

Last season, GSL finished ninth in the conference. To improve upon that, Savre said her girls will have to work hard during practice, avoid loafing, and have her seniors lead by example.

"Not cutting corners. Not jogging behind because the coach isn't right there with you," were some of the things Savre mentioned her Panthers need to avoid. "And the seniors need to make sure that that happens, because it really helps if it comes from them."

After one week of practice, Savre said she sent a text out to her upperclassmen thanking them for the leadership and ownership they displayed.

Senior Taylor Venier will be looked upon heavily for such guidance and reinforcement as the only returning senior letter winner. The other seniors on the 2014 team are Josie and Mary Schmitt, Peyton Miska-Alberts, Becca Green, and Micanna Maresh. Green and Maresh are listed on the JV roster with sophomore Marlina Chelman. The other four are listed as varsity, along with sophomore Erica Hecksel. Not one junior is on the roster.

The Panthers won't face a WCC opponent until Tuesday, Sept. 2 when Annandale and Orono visit Glencoe.

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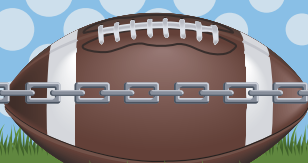
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Being close

For the purpose of this Ordinance the following terms, phrases, words and any derivations shall have the meaning given herein.

Community Tree Plan - shall mean a written document that guides the work of the Tree Commission.

City - is a city, town or political unit of the State of Minnesota.

City Arborist - a citizen of the City and member of the Tree Commission who volunteers to carry out the enforcement of said Ordinance.

Large Trees - designated as those attaining a height of forty-five (45) with a mature spread of 40 feet or more.

Medium Trees - designated as those attaining a height of thirty (30) to forty-five (45) with a mature spread of 30 feet or more.

Park - shall include all public parks having individual names.

Person - any person, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association or organization of any kind.

Property Line - shall mean the outer edge of a street or highway right of way (R.O.W.).

Property Owner - shall mean the person owning such property as shown on the city Plat maps.

Public Places - shall include all grounds owned by the city.

Public Trees - shall include all ornamental and shade trees now or hereafter growing on any street or on any public land where otherwise indicated.

Small Trees - designated as those attaining a height of twenty (20) to thirty (30) feet with a mature spread of 20 feet or more.

Street or Highway - refers to the entire width of every public way or

right of way when any part thereof is open to the use of the public, as a matter of right, for purposes of vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

Treelawn (R.O.W. edge) - that part of the street or highway not covered by sidewalk or other paving, lying between the property line and the edge of the street.

Urban Forest - shall mean the collection of shrubs, trees, vegetation, and associated natural features that make up the city tree canopy and its growing zone.

Section 3. Tree Commission Established.

There shall be created commission to be known and designated as the "Tree Commission."

1. The Tree Commission shall be composed of five (5) citizens, with experience or knowledge of trees and gardening.

a. Four (4) voting members, one of whom shall be designated the City Arborist, shall be appointed by the Mayor with approval of the City Council. The Mayor shall be an ex-officio member.

b. The four (4) members, including the City Arborist, shall be appointed annually by the Mayor with approval of the City Council.

c. All members of the commission shall serve without pay.

Section 4. Authority Given to the Tree Commission.

The duties of the "Tree Commission" shall be as follows:

1. To assist with properly constituted officials of the city as well as citizens and community groups, in the dissemination of news and information regarding the selection, planting and maintenance of trees within the corporate limits, whether they be on private or public property.

2. To study the urban forest including problems involving the city tree population, determine needs, compose and review annually a Tree Plan and seek ways to implement it.

3. To provide regular and special meetings at which the subject of the urban forest may be discussed by the citizens of the city.

a. Within a reasonable amount of time after the appointment of the Tree Commission, the Commission shall meet and organize by the election of a chairman and vice chairman. The Commission shall elect from their membership, a City Arborist who will act as secretary and conduct the normal affairs of the Tree Commission as described below.

b. A majority of voting members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

4. The Tree Commission shall provide for the adoption of rules and procedures for the holding of regular and special meetings as said Commission shall deem advisable and necessary in order to perform the duties set forth. A journal of proceedings and activities is to be recorded.

5. The Tree Commission may engage in any other lawful activity in pursuit of the mission of this commission which may benefit the urban forest.

Section 5. Qualifications of the City Arborist.

City Arborist shall, where possible, be a person skilled or trained in forestry, horticulture or other closely related field.

Section 6. Duties of the City Arborist.

The City Arborist shall make rules governing the planting, maintenance and removal of trees on the streets or other public sites in the City.

Section 7. Authority of the City Arborist.

1. The City Arborist shall report to the Tree Commission on a regular basis and shall be in attendance at all regular and special meetings of the Tree Commission, Tree Commission Sub-committees or other community meetings as designated by the Chairman.

a. The City Arborist shall record all activities of the Commission or subcommittees of the Commission.

2. The City Arborist shall have the authority and jurisdiction of regulating the planting, maintenance and removal of trees on streets and other publicly owned properties to insure the safety or preserve the integrity of such public sites by granting permits.

a. The City Arborist shall have the authority to affix reasonable conditions to the granting of a permit in accordance with the terms of Ordinance.

Section 8. Community Tree Plan.

1. Community Tree Plan. The Tree Commission shall have the authority to formulate a Community Tree Plan with the advice of consultants, agencies and approval of the City Council.

a. The Community Tree Plan shall include but not be limited to the goals and missions of the Tree Commission, an inventory of resources, needed work, associated cost and time schedules for work and relevant information such as activities of the Tree Commission, standard tree maintenance and planting specifications and permit application procedures.

Section 9. Required Permits.

The following tree permits are required.

1. Planting, Maintenance and Removal

a. No person shall plant, spray, fertilize, remove, prune or otherwise disturb any tree on any street or public owned property without first procuring a permit from the City Arborist.

2. Planting Permit

a. Application data. When making application for a planting permit on publicly owned property, the Applicant shall illustrate the number and types of trees or other plants to be planted.

b. Proper Planting. When any tree shall be planted on public land it shall be planted, staked, fertilized, watered, mulched and otherwise cared for according to proper planting specifications issued by the City Arborist.

3. Maintenance Permit

a. Application Data. When making application for a maintenance permit the Applicant shall state the number and kinds of trees to be

sprayed, fertilized, pruned or otherwise preserved; the kind of treatment to be administered; the composition of the spray materials to be applied; and other such information as the City Arborist shall deem reasonably necessary to determine issuance of permit.

4. Removal and Replacement Permit a. When making application for a tree removal permit the Applicant shall describe the number and kinds of trees to be removed, their size, location, health/age condition and the proposed method of removal and other such information as the City Arborist shall deem reasonably necessary to determine issuance of permit.

Section 10. Trees on Private Property.

1. It shall be the duty of any person or persons owning or occupying real property bordering on any street upon which there may be trees, to prune such trees in such manner that they will not obstruct; utilities (such as power lines or street light), the passage of pedestrians on sidewalks, vision of traffic signs or views of any street or drivable intersection.

2. It shall be the duty of any person or occupying real property, bordering on any street, park or other public land, on which there may be trees that are diseased or insect infested, to remove, spray or treat said trees in such a manner that they will not inflict, damage or endanger any nearby public vegetation or citizens in use of area.

3. The City Arborist may order the pruning, treatment or removal of trees on private land that cause obstruction, present insect or disease problems or are in otherwise present danger to public health or safety.

Section 11. Abuse of Public Trees.

No person shall intentionally damage, cut, transplant, carve or remove any tree; attach any wire, rope, advertisements, nails, posters or other apparatus to any tree; allow any gaseous liquid or solid substance which is deemed harmful to trees to come in contact with them; or set fire or permit any fire to burn when such fire or the heat thereof will injure any portion of the tree.

Section 12. Interference with City/Town Arborist.

No person or persons shall delay, hinder, prevent or interfere with the City Arborist while engaging in carrying out the execution or enforcement of this Ordinance.

Section 13. Protection of Municipal Trees.

All public trees shall be protected during construction.

1. All trees on any street or other publicly owned property near any excavation or construction of any building, structure or street work, shall be guarded with an appropriately substantial fence, frame or box. The "Tree Guard" shall not be less than four (4) feet high and eight (8) feet square, or at a distance in feet from the tree trunk equal to the diameter of the trunk at breast height (D.B.H.) in inches, whichever being the greater. All building materials, dirt or other debris shall be kept outside the Tree Guard.

2. No person shall change natural drainage or attempt to excavate any ditches, tunnels, trenches or lay any drive within a radius of ten (10) feet from any public tree without first obtaining a written permit from the City Arborist.

Section 14. Placing Materials on Public Property.

No person or persons shall place, deposit, store or maintain upon any public place, any stone, sand, concrete, brick or other material which may impede the passage of water, air or fertilizer to the roots of any tree growing therein. Sunlight to any public tree shall not be permanently blocked by placement of materials without written authorization of the City Arborist.

Section 15. Enforcement, Penalty, and Appeals.

Any person, firm or corporation in violation of compliance with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined a sum no less than one hundred (\$100.00) dollar, nor more than one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars or may be imprisoned for a term not exceeding sixty (30) days, or both.

advises, hires, counsels, or conspires with or otherwise procures another to commit the prohibited act.

(c) A person who hosts an event or gathering does not have to be present at the event or gathering to be criminally responsible.

Subd. 5. **Enforcement.** This ordinance may be enforced by the Silver Lake Police Department or any law enforcement officer assisting the Silver Lake Police Department.

Subd. 7. **Severability.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word, or other portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, in whole, or in part, by any court of competent

jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed severable, and such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this law, which remaining portions shall continue in full force and effect.

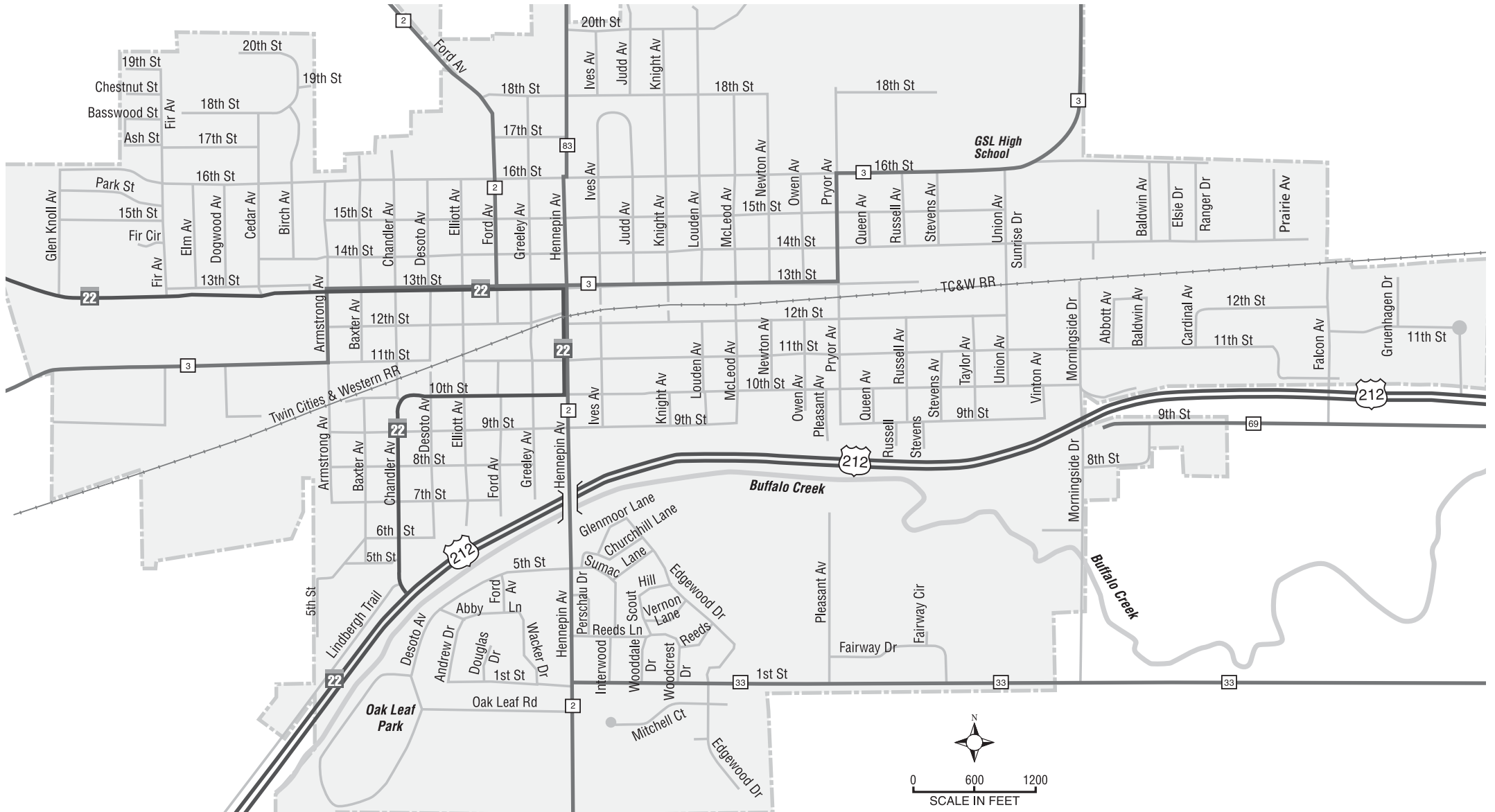
Subd. 8. **Penalty.** Violation of subdivision 4 is a misdemeanor which carries with it a maximum penalty of 90 days jail and/or \$1,000 fine.

Section 2, Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days following its final passage and adoption.

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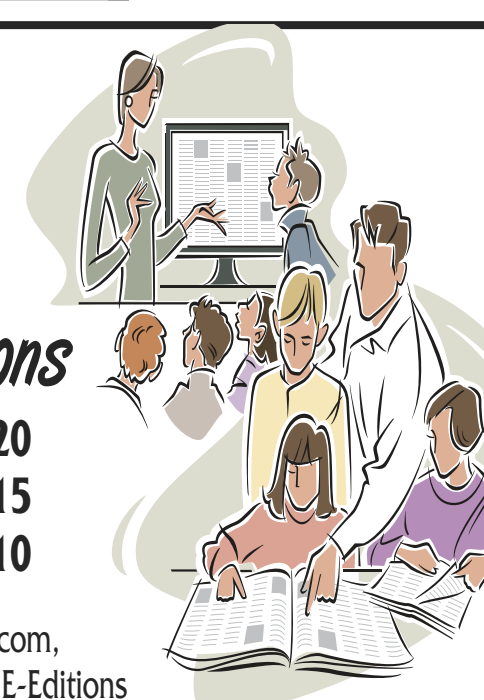
